

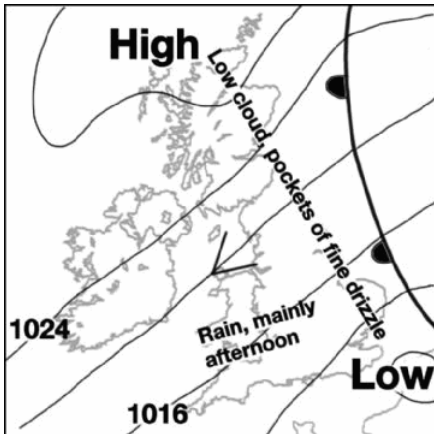
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Thursday, 5 September, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 5 September, 2024

Low cloud will bring persistent fog to most mountains, toward the east, many lower slopes shrouded. A few showers, mainly England will drift inland. Separately patches of heavier rain will affect South Wales. Very gusty strong winds will affect many mountain areas south from southern Scotlands.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Fairly light wind. Sheet low cloud covering nearly all mountains.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 5 September, 2024

How windy? (On the Munros)	Northeasterly 15mph, but strengthening to 20-25mph, but on Ochils perhaps 30mph late afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Small most of day, but expect sometimes sudden buffeting in very gusty wind near central belt.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Areas of fine drizzle Extensively dry near and west of A9. Elsewhere, areas of fine drizzle, in places most of the day - most likely Angus and Ochils
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Very extensive, but breaking near/west of A9 Blanket very low cloud will come on off the North Sea shrouding most areas from lower slopes up. Near and west of the A9, most cloud above 500 to 700m by midday - may sometimes lift to 900m or temporarily clear. 10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloudy or dull but mostly good visibility below cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	7C, rising toward 10C through day. Above the summits.

<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Little or more likely no rain</p> <p>Fine drizzle, confined to some lower slopes, mainly morning.</p>	<p>Rain very unlikely</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free Munros?</p>	<p>Most summits cloud free all day: fog some lower slopes, especially morning.</p> <p>Higher areas free of cloud (above an inversion), but in some areas fog lower slopes.</p> <p>The cloud will be below 6000m, most extensive morning near and east of Glenshee and Ochils.</p> <p>80%</p>	<p>Little if any - although fog some lower slopes morning</p> <p>The mountains cloud free all day. But fog in and above some valleys (up to 450m) at dawn (mainly surrounding Ochils and east of Glenshee) will break up through morning.</p> <p>90%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Extensive bright sunshine higher areas, although away from western mountains dull or foggy lower areas, especially morning. Superb visibility on the mountains, hazy lower areas.</p>	<p>Extensive or unbroken bright sunshine and superb visibility - in places in morning above fog lower slopes.</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 900m)</p> <p>Freezing Level</p>	<p>16 to 19C - unusually warm. (Colder lower slopes morning).</p> <p>Above the summits</p>	<p>A very warm 16 to 18C.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 6 September, 2024

Warm and frequently dry on most mountains until Sunday. It will then turn progressively colder as easterly winds back toward the north. For most areas rainfall will be low until well into next week. Nevertheless, some patches of rain (heavy in places) mainly England and particularly Wales until Sunday. It may then begin to turn wetter across the Scottish Highlands.
