

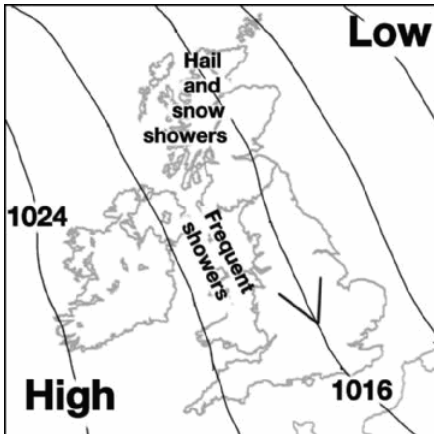
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Thursday, 12 September, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 September, 2024

Very cold for September; hail and snow in showers across the mountains in Scotland, and hail and sleet highest tops Snowdon range (where precipitation frequent). Elsewhere, a few brief showers and frequent bright sunshine. Nevertheless, feeling well below freezing point across the mountains directly in the wind.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Snow and hail flurries. Feeling bitterly cold in the wind.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 12 September, 2024

<p>How windy? (On the Munros)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>Northwesterly, mostly around 25mph, but particularly near showers and on higher tops 30mph, perhaps sometimes 35mph. Overall will drop slowly through the day.</p> <p>Will impede ease of walking on higher areas, but on highest areas and near showers buffeting considerable, particularly morning. Marked wind chill.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Hail and higher up, snow showers</p> <p>A few showers of flurries, mainly afternoon; of hail, and above 750m to in afternoon 1000m snow - the snow lying on highest tops.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free Munros?</p>	<p>Clearing most or all summits for periods.</p> <p>Cloud widely across higher areas from dawn, but cloud base rising through morning. From late morning, cloud mostly above 1050m; although mofen above the summits - although fragments forming on higher slopes near showers.</p> <p>80% by late morning</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Bright sun 'in and out'; most extensive morning. Very good or excellent visibility,</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 900m)</p> <p>Freezing Level</p>	<p>0C, rising to 4C. Directly in the wind will feel as cold as minus 10C in morning</p> <p>900m; rising to 1300m.</p>

<p>How windy? (On the Munros)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>West later backing southerly 20mph. Toward evening, strengthening toward 35mph from west.</p> <p>Mostly small in a lengthy lull, but before dusk anticipate significant buffeting and wind chill.</p>	<p>Southwesterly between 35mph near central belt and 40-45mph elsewhere.</p> <p>Difficult conditions: significant wind chill and walking widely arduous. You could be blown over where exposed on higher slopes.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Dry most of daylight</p> <p>Risk of the odd brief shower. Toward evening, rain spreading in.</p>	<p>Rain and drizzle on and off</p> <p>Rain and drizzle, most constant west of A9. May well amount to little in total Ochils and east of Glenshee.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p>	<p>Summits extensively cloud free</p> <p>Fragments on higher slopes after dawn and again toward evening when will become widespread from west above 500m.</p>	<p>Very extensive</p> <p>Generally, fog from 450 to 650m upward most of the day. The base may reach 750m at times Ochils and near and east of Glenshee.</p>
<p>Chance of cloud free Munros?</p>	<p>90%; dropping toward evening from southwest</p>	<p>10%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Periods of sun, but increasingly cloudy later in day. Visibility mostly excellent.</p>	<p>A little sun may come through mainly lower slopes near and east of A9. Visibility sometimes good, but misty in rain.</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 900m)</p> <p>Freezing Level</p>	<p>1C, rising to 6 to 8C, warmest eastern summits.</p> <p>1050m, gradually lifting above the summits. Widespread frost lowland and upland valleys post dawn.</p>	<p>9C. Will feel as cold as minus 3C directly in the wind. Above the summits.</p>

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 13 September, 2024

Turning warmer from the weekend. Very little rain for a week to ten days (perhaps longer) for England and Wales, but in Scotland, particularly western mountains, rain (mainly Saturday and Monday - although the precise timing uncertain), Around Tuesday the fine warm water will extend across Scotland.
