

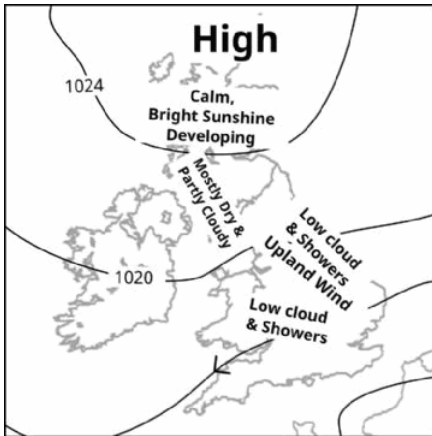
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Wednesday, 2 October, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 2 October, 2024

Sunny and dry in the Highlands, only glens in cloud in the morning. Rare showers in southern Scotland, more frequent in northern England - Lake District shall stay mostly dry, some sun here. Wet & cloudy morning in Peak District and on most Welsh hills, there slowly improving.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Sunny and dry, just patches of morning fog. Cool, light winds

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 2 October, 2024

How windy? (On the Munros)	Easterly 10 to 20mph, locally less on some slopes; gustier toward the central belt, and just west of some high tops.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but sudden gusts very locally may briefly impede ease of walking.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance fine drizzle on some slopes briefly in east.
Cloud on the hills?	Early low cloud, clearing Patches of low cloud mainly toward east in the morning, likely down to valley bottom - mountains above 600m should stay above the cloud. Tending to thin and break up during day.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often clear skies, clouds only in glens north of Pitlochry and toward the east. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	5C, rising slightly by afternoon.
Freezing Level	Above the summits, but frost at dawn in most glens and some sheltered higher areas.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 3 October	Friday 4 October
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	South to southwesterly, 5 to 15mph in the morning, later slightly increasing but no more than 25mph. Fairly small, in the east most of the day negligible, toward central highlands noticeable afternoon.	Southerly, 30 to 40mph, may be very gusty with gusts reaching or even exceeding 50mph. Walking becoming arduous, gusts may knock you off your feet on exposed terrain. Significant wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	Most likely dry, risk rain afternoon west Dry morning, in the afternoon low risk rain moving in from the west.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear, valleys covered by fog Widespread morning fog in the valleys, up to even 600-700m (cloud top). Cloud rising a little through the day, largely breaking and dissipating.	Glens covered, hills widely clear Very low cloud in glens. Cloud top rarely higher than 600m. Cloud dissipating during the day. Perhaps clouds building up near tops around Loch Tay later.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80% above morning fog	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunny with fair weather clouds. Excellent visibility.	Except for low cloud in some valleys widely sunny, some clouds in the afternoon. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	4 to 7C Above the summits, but frost at dawn inland glens and some sheltered higher areas.	6 to 7C, with inversion a little warmer higher up, but in wind feeling below -5C. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 3 October, 2024**

Dry and sunny Thursday, on Friday only in western Scotland deteriorating conditions, especially beware of severe winds in Highlands in general. Lowering pressure and southwesterly winds toward the weekend brings an unsettled spell- rain at times, briefly milder air. Likely turning colder again during the weekend onward into early next week. Cold and showery toward next Wednesday.
