

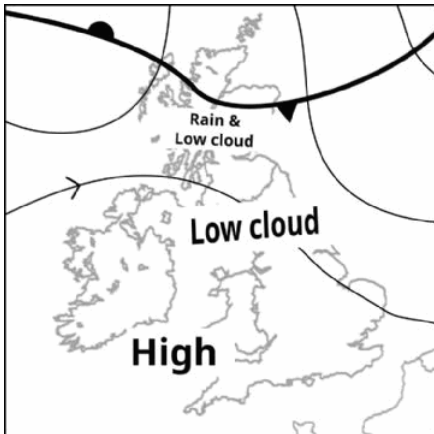
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.

## General Summary for Friday, 1 November, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 1 November, 2024

Widely dull and overcast, in Highlands frequent rain, especially in the north, where windy at start. Mostly mild or warm. In England and Wales isolated spots of drizzle possible, but generally dry. Best chances for sun in northern Scotland in the afternoon, after the rain has passed.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Frequent rain, overcast and dull, mild. Drier toward south

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 1 November, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Starting westerly, 20 to 30mph. Gradually easing to 10-15mph and becoming variable.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	In the morning buffeting, walking slightly impeded. Becoming small.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Rain over higher terrain, mostly dry on southern hills</b> Frequent rain, most intense central highlands, may be fairly persistent for several hours. Likely dry for most of the day Ochil and Angus hills, here only afternoon drizzly showers.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive, chance for improvement</b> Cloud widely covering the hills, lower slopes at times clearing if longer breaks in rain occur. Chance for more breaks in the afternoon.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and dull. Poor visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	6 to 8C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

**Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead**

	<b>Saturday 2 November</b>	<b>Sunday 3 November</b>
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Southwesterly, mostly 10 to 20mph.	Variable, 10mph or less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small.</b>	<b>Small or negligible.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Risk occasional drizzle from low cloud.	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive at start, likely partly breaking</b>  Hills covered in cloud from 500-800m upward at start, cloud slowly lifting, may partly break. Chance for higher cloud base toward the east.	<b>Hills clear, morning cloud in glens</b>  Low cloud and fog in glens, from mid-slopes upward clear. Fog dissipating during the day, later widely clear skies also from the valley perspective.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>20%</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Very little or no sun.  Very good visibility if not in cloud.	Plenty of sunshine and excellent visibility if above the cloud.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	7 or 8C	Around 10C, lower down colder.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 2 November, 2024**

Back to high pressure conditions for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion developing means often very misty or cloudy, but tops sometimes above cloud - especially the Munros. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until mid next week, when a weak front passage will probably deteriorate weather for a day, at least in Scotland. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and even warmer weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week.
