
Southeastern Highlands

General Summary for Wednesday, 6 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 6 November, 2024

Widely murky and dull with very little sun, best chances west Wales and northern Scotland. Drizzle in places, mostly along western coast and in southern Highlands. Light winds in Wales, breezy elsewhere, locally gusty in Scotland. Generally mild.

Murky with drizzle, in places gusty. Mild

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 6 November, 2024

How windy? (On the Munros)	South to southwesterly, 15-20mph, locally less on some slopes, but up to 35mph for periods highest tops central highlands.	
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, locally blustery over exposed higher terrain, affecting comfortable walking at times.	
How wet?	Rain unlikely

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 7 November, 2024

Southerly flow until end of the week, damp with clouds, but possibly more often breaks in cloud on Thursday and on Friday for eastern hills, while western coastal mountains will get some rain. Often cloudy but mostly dry on Saturday, before another weak front strikes on Sunday, bringing rain again to westernmost hills. Next week high pressure centres over the UK, sunnier conditions with hardly any rain are expected until next weekend, when weather may switch to more wet pattern. Until then, fairly mild.
