
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Monday, 24 March, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 24 March, 2025

Westerly winds strengthening, reaching gale force over tops in the Highlands. Rain moves into northwest Scotland, setting in heavier during afternoon; patchy rain extending southeastwards later. Dry all daylight for England, Wales and southern Scotland, with good amounts of sunshine.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Increasingly windy, later gales tops. Patchy rain later from west.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 24 March, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Westerly, a lull of around 20mph in morning, then strengthening toward 35mph, or 40mph highest tops by dusk.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, then starting to affect comfortable walking, later increasingly arduous with considerable wind chill.	
How wet?	A little rain later in day	
(Precipitation and its impact)	Morning: Rain not expected. Afternoon: Still little or no rain, but occasional light rain reaching at least the central highlands later.	
Cloud on the hills?	Nearly all summits clearing; lowering later	
	Cloud coming and going above 900m until mid morning, then for several hours all summits likely to clear. Lowering from west later afternoon, increasingly covering tops west of the A9.	
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sun will gradually give way as cloud thickens from west. Excellent visibility.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	3C, rising slowly through the day to 5C. Wind chill feeling as cold as -8C as speeds increase.	
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	

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Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 25 March	Wednesday 26 March
How windy? (On the Munros)	West to northwesterly 20 to 30mph.	Southwesterly, strengthening 30 to 45mph, possibly 60mph higher tops toward evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Starting to affect balance where exposed on high summits and ridges. Marked wind chill.	Deteriorating to make walking increasingly arduous, later difficult on higher terrain, wind chill becoming significant.
How wet?	Dry all day	Rain unlikely until evening
(Precipitation and its impact)	Remnants of overnight rain clearing before dawn to leave a dry day.	Risk of rain developing from the west by dusk onward into night.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little	Occasional patches
	Local brief patches over higher slopes in the morning, lifting to be mostly above higher summits.	Patchy mist lower slopes from dawn. Some cloud banks drifting over upper slopes, mainly central highlands, but many hills often clear. Toward evening, risk lowering cloud starting to fill in from west.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80%	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sunshine, often sunny east. Visibility excellent.	A veil of high cloud with a little weak sun; cloud tending to thicken from west. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	3 to 6C. Wind chill feeling like -5C.	1 to 4C. Wind chill feeling like -10C, nearer -15C as speeds increase.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Close to freezing some sheltered higher and lower slopes at dawn; otherwise above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 25 March, 2025

A mixed westerly regime for the next week to ten days - fronts coming in from the west bringing spells of rain, interspersed with better days under ridges of high pressure. Rain most frequent in western Scotland. Frequently windy, periods of gale force wind over the mountains. Temperature varied, sometimes just below freezing on higher Scottish summits, with some showers of snow at times on the Munros - chillier more widely by Friday into Saturday as wind turns northwesterly for a time.

Forecast issued at 16:08 on Sunday, 23 March, 2025
