

Southeastern Highlands

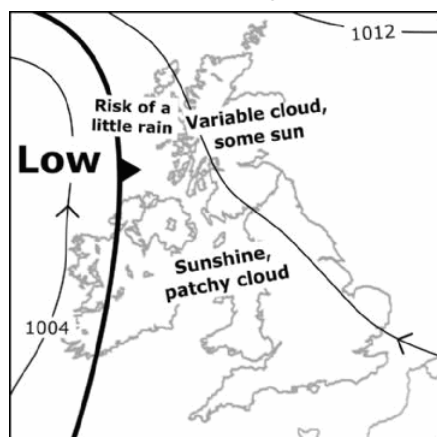
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Sunday, 20 April, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 20 April, 2025

A fine day for most places. Patchy cloud in the morning lifting or clearing from most or all hills. Southeasterly winds generally light, locally gustier west coast of Scotland, where remnants of a front may also bring a little light rain onto Mull and Skye.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Dry, light winds, patchy cloud on hills breaking.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 20 April, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	East or southeasterly 10 to 15mph, occasional 20mph central highlands.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance of an odd pocket of drizzle around early cloud banks.
Cloud on the hills?	Rising to tops, breaks forming Varied cloud banks on some slopes from dawn into morning, lifting to upper slopes where may come and go, then more often clearing afternoon.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30% rising to 70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun and high cloud. Visibility mostly good, becoming very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	1C rising to 5C; easternmost hills may stay slightly cooler.
Freezing Level	Near 1000m from dawn into early morning; rising above the summits.

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southeasterly 10 to 20mph.	Variable 10 to 15mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk isolated showers later Likely dry for many hours, but increasing risk by late afternoon of localised slow-moving showers forming.	Showers mostly afternoon An odd patch of rain possible in the morning. Increasing risk into the afternoon of slow-moving showery bursts forming.
Cloud on the hills?	Low cloud gradually dispersing Banks of cloud perhaps widely over hill slopes from some lower elevations upward in the morning, some high tops may be above cloud for a time. Gradually lifting to upper slopes then above tops afternoon.	Lifting toward tops or above Local mist in glens at dawn. Patches of cloud around mid to upper slopes in the morning, rising to higher tops then above many summits into afternoon. Returning at various heights if showers form.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	50%	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Some sun mostly through high cloud, skies fairly cloudy into afternoon. Misty start, visibility improving to be good.	Sun and varied high cloud. Cloud bubbling up and filling in later. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	3 to 5C.	3 to 5C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Just above highest summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 21 April, 2025

Early in the new week, slack low pressure drifting over the country brings areas of showery rain mostly into afternoons, moving around slowly under light winds, most widely England and Wales. Drier from midweek as high pressure expands in from the north. Quiet weather patterns may then continue through the end of the month with light winds and occasional scattered showers. Cool on eastern hills, near to freezing higher Scottish tops. Warmest and sunniest in western regions. Occasional frost overnight into glens.

Forecast issued at 16:00 on Saturday, 19 April, 2025
