

# Southeastern Highlands

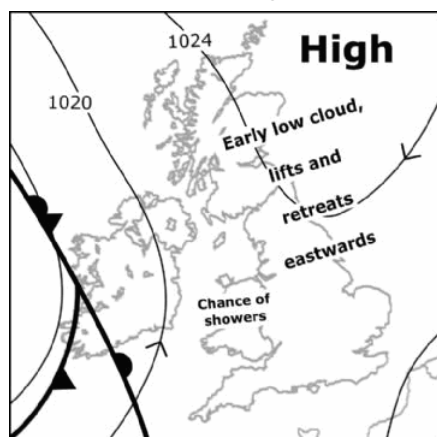
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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### General Summary for Thursday, 24 April, 2025



#### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 24 April, 2025

Low cloud from the North Sea covering all but some western mountains widely from dawn will gradually clear as it retreats eastwards into the middle of the day, some patches may remain on eastern slopes. Sunny most or all day western coasts. Small risk an afternoon shower.

#### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Low cloud lifting to give patches of sun. Fairly light wind.

### Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 24 April, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	East to southeasterly 10-15mph, increasing a little toward evening.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Possible fine drizzle in cloud. Small risk of an isolated afternoon shower.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Lifting and clearing</b> Cloud widespread morning between about 450m and 900/1000m - higher summits frequently above the cloud. From late morning or midday will progressively break up: very little left by mid or late afternoon. <b>Becoming greater than 90% (cloud lower down particularly morning)</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Broken cloud and sun; fair-weather cloud may cover sky for a time afternoon. Misty start in places; visibility then excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	2C rising to 5C; easternmost hills may stay slightly cooler.  Above the summits, but slight frost some sheltered higher and lower slopes at dawn.

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Southeasterly 20-30mph, gusty over exposed high terrain.	Southerly 15 to 25mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Walking becoming impeded, stability challenged in strongest direct wind. Feeling chilly.</b>	<b>Fairly small</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>A little drizzle</b> Fine drizzle where in cloud, feeling generally damp. Otherwise, a little patchy rain may develop toward the Trossachs in afternoon.	<b>A little rain, risk a showery burst</b> Patchy rain and drizzle, mostly central highlands in the morning. May largely fade out, but risk an odd burst of rain almost anywhere into afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive, thinning a little</b>  Low cloud across many slopes in the morning, most persistent south-facing hills. Lifting and thinning toward upper slopes, some breaks possible into afternoon. Later cloud banks may lower again from west.	<b>Extensive, rising slowly</b>  Widely covering the hills in the morning, banks at various heights, in places to lower slopes. Only slowly lifting toward upper slopes, some breaks forming later afternoon to 900m or above.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>30%</b>	<b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Little or no sun, glimpses through high cloud. Visibility mostly poor, good out of cloud.	Little or no sun, glimpses late afternoon. Misty, murky start widely, visibility slowly improving to become good below cloud.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	2C rising to 4C. Feeling like -5C in direct wind.	5C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits. Slight frost at dawn some eastern glens.	Above the summits

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 25 April, 2025

Weak fronts will encroach from the Atlantic by Friday into the weekend, bringing more humid air, with low cloud and patchy rain or drizzle, local showery bursts. Possibility of more persistent rain in western Scotland by Sunday with stronger southwesterly winds for a time. Generally mild, or increasingly warm into early next week as southerly air prevails. High pressure rebuilding with a good deal of dry and sunny weather expected next week into the start of May.

### Forecast issued at 7:46 on Thursday, 24 April, 2025
