

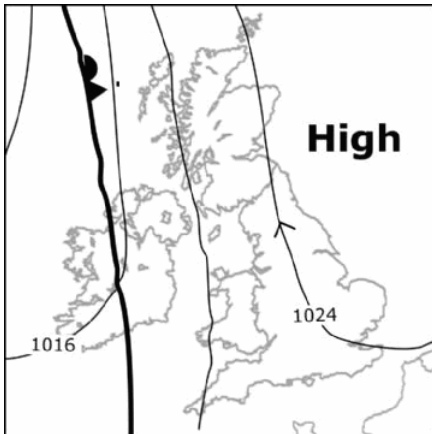
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Friday, 25 April, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 25 April, 2025

Most mountain areas becoming fine and warm as patches of early morning low cloud disperse. However, a front approaching western Scotland will bring strengthening wind, thickening cloud and then rain to more western mountains.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Fairly light wind. Extensive low cloud.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 25 April, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southerly typically 15 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Chance fine drizzle in cloud Fine drizzle here and there, mainly east of A9 in morning. Toward dusk, chance of a few spots of rain west of A9.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive low cloud, particularly east of A9 Low cloud, base 400 to 600m most or all day, the base tending to rise slowly (generally lowest and most persistent near and east of Glenshee and Ochils). May by afternoon break up west of A9 and occasionally lift elsewhere.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely cloudy or dull. Visibility excellent below cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m)	2C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Saturday 26 April	Sunday 27 April
How windy? (On the Munros)	Southerly 20 to on higher tops 25mph - perhaps 30mph some higher tops.	South to southwesterly, in the range 30 to perhaps near central belt at times 40mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small.	Expect considerable buffeting and wind chill where exposed on higher areas.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain on and off, mainly morning. Rain, rarely heavy, now and again, mainly morning west of A9. Total rainfall small	Rain on and off Confidence low: Occasional rain, perhaps amounting to very little indeed, particularly east of A9.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive on higher areas Cloud base generally 400 to 650m. There will be a trend toward higher bases through the day.	Most summits frequently or persistently cloud covered. Generally cloud base rising from 450 to 700m, generally highest near and east of Glenshee.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	10%	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun, mainly afternoon lower slopes. Misty, murky in rain, but otherwise visibility often excellent.	Occasional sunshine near and east of Glenshee. in rain, misty, although otherwise very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	5C	4C, but will feel as cold as minus 5C directly in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 26 April, 2025**

The remnants of fronts will bring patches of rain and low cloud to most mountain areas on Saturday before tending to become confined to Scotland on Sunday (when the exact detail as yet uncertain). The rain may linger across NW Scotland into Monday before very warm dry air extends north across all mountains.
