

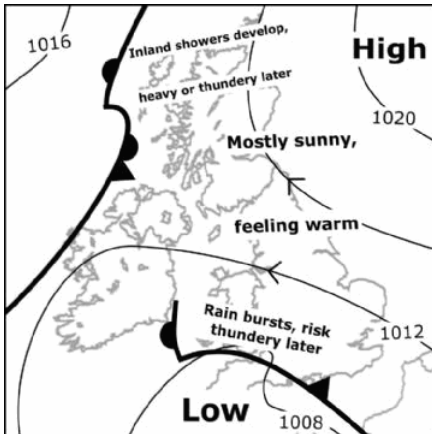
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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## General Summary for Sunday, 11 May, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 11 May, 2025

Showers develop inland western Scotland, heavy bursts or thunderstorms possible northwest later. Chance spots of rain south Scotland and north England, though mostly sunny. Modest winds here, some increase after dusk. Bursts of showery rain south Wales, chance localised thunderstorms later; some drift into north Wales.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

High cloud gradually builds; low chance of rain

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 11 May, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Southerly 10-20mph. An easing in the later afternoon approaches from the west with winds under 10mph and direction variable.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Little rain expected</b> Chance isolated spots of light rain in the afternoon. Increasing likelihood late in the day, possibly an odd heavier shower.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Not expected</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Nearly certain</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Mostly sunny, a patchwork of cloud building through afternoon. Intermittent or only glimpses of sun remaining around dusk. Excellent visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	8 or 9C, rising towards 11C through the day.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	East or southeasterly, 15-25mph.	Southeasterly or variable 10mph or less. Some 15mph breezes southernmost areas.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small, comfortable walking becoming affected in highest winds.</b>	<b>Negligible</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Chance odd spots of rain west</b> Detail uncertain: A few odd spots of light rain may come and go around Loch Tay. Chance largely dry.	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little or none after morning sea fog</b>  Patches of sea fog around lower slopes of eastern hills soon dissipates. Occasional cloud banks drift over high tops west of A9 though hills often clear.	<b>Dawn sea fog east soon dissipates</b>  Patches of sea fog on easternmost slopes at dawn, occasionally drifting up towards middle slopes. Fading to cloud-free by noon.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>80%</b>	<b>Becoming above 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Intermittent sun between high cloud becoming more frequent. Excellent visibility.	Widely sunny after fog fades. Excellent visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	8C, rising to 10C. Easternmost hills may see little or no temperature change.	8C for most at dawn. Rising to 11C on easternmost hills, nearer 13C towards central Highlands.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits	Above the summits

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 12 May, 2025**

Lingering bursts of rain in Wales early next week will gradually fade as low pressure slips away. Only odd spots of rain in northwest England and west Scotland, soon fading. A continental wind track and high pressure to the east will keep most cloud above the summits next week, with eastern areas often sunny. Settled conditions prevail midweek into next weekend as high pressure reestablishes just north of the British Isles. A mix of cloud and sun with light winds, generally easterly though variable with little change day to day. Slight frosts at dawn in sheltered spots, mostly warm by day. Very dry ground conditions, beware high risk of fire.
