


Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Monday, 7 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 7 July, 2025

Northwesterly winds will be blustery over the mountains, feeling distinctly chilly in exposure. Plenty of dry weather, some showers toward the north and east of Scotland. Showery rain for Wales early in the day fades. Cloud clearing many tops and some sun.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands
 Windy and cool. Largely dry, broken cloud.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 7 July, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Northwesterly 25-35mph early, risk stronger east of A9. Then 25mph most of the day with stronger gusts over tops.
Effect of wind on you?	Often buffeting gusts over high terrain and downslope, may challenge stability at times. Feeling cool.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Substantially dry A few odd showers may drift onto northernmost hills east of the A9.
Cloud on the hills?	Summits increasingly cloud-free Some cloud caps over high tops in the morning, lifting and breaking for largely cloud-free summits.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Soon 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sun becoming fairly extensive; fair weather cloud develops later, mostly east. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	6C rising to 10 or 11C. Feeling below freezing in the wind in morning, around 3C afternoon.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 8 July	Wednesday 9 July
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Northwesterly shifting westerly, 15-25mph, easing a little through morning, then increasing again into later afternoon. Fairly small, though notable gusts over tops when winds are stronger.	Westerly 15 to 25mph. Fairly small, but feeling breezy on exposed higher areas.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain until late Local spots of drizzly rain arrive onto central highlands hills late in the day, amounting to very little.	Drizzly spots mostly west Occasional patches of drizzle mostly central highlands.
Cloud on the hills?	Intermittent caps over tops only later A few cloud caps over high tops towards central highlands soon lift off summits. Into evening, patchy cloud intermittently returns to high tops, at times drifting down west slopes towards central highlands.	Extensive west, breaks east Fairly extensive above 800-1000m central highlands up to the A9, often 700-800m hills around the Trossachs. Higher cloud base eastwards, mostly above 900-1000m near and east of Glenshee.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Above 90%, reducing to 60% late	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly extensive sun early though high cloud building, largely overcast later. Excellent visibility.	Largely cloudy, glimpses of sun mostly eastern areas. Visibility good below cloud, particularly in east.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	8C and rising, though with a west-to-east contrast: near 12C Callander area, up to 14C Glenshee. Above the summits	10C, rising to 13C toward east afternoon, humid. Above the summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 8 July, 2025**

Low pressure to the northwest maintains a humid southwesterly wind mid-late this week, with fronts situated near northwestern coasts - often extensive low cloud here with some drizzly rain. Drier with sun and broken cloud in east and southern Scotland. High pressure expanding over England and Wales brings more sunshine and draws in increasingly very warm air again in the later part of this week, higher temperatures extending into Scotland with time; some mist may continue to affect coasts in the west.

Forecast issued at 16:00 on Sunday, 6 July, 2025
