

Southeastern Highlands

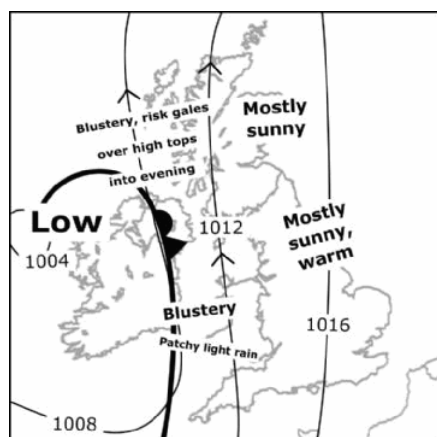

General Summary for Tuesday, 9 September, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 9 September, 2025

Windy near west coasts of Scotland and Wales, risk of gales over high tops later in the day; local cloud and light morning rain, then dry and largely clear. Some morning light rain and cloud for Lakeland too, also clearing. Mostly clear hills east Scotland though blustery. Mostly sunny and warm along the Pennines.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Mostly sunny; blustery over tops, speeds rising into evening

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 9 September, 2025

| How windy? (On the Munros) | South-southeasterly 15-25mph. Strengthening into evening and night, towards 25-35mph, gusting 40mph over tops. |
| Effect of wind on you? | Fairly small most of the day, though winds at times affecting comfort of walking on exposed tops. Becoming strenuous late in the day with considerable buffeting in exposure and feeling cool. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Little rain expected Small chance of local patches of light rain developing around central highlands afternoon - will amount to very little. |
| Cloud on the hills? | Summits likely becoming free of cloud Patchy mist in sheltered glens from dawn with variable patches upslope, mostly west of A9 and around Loch Tay. Cloud largely lifting off summits, though a few fleeting cloud caps over high tops come and go. |
| Chance of cloud free Munros? | 90% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Extensive sunshine for several hours in the morning. Fair weather cloud builds through afternoon, some thicker high cloud west as well. Excellent visibility. |
| How Cold? (at 900m) | 6 to 7C from dawn, rising to 9C most areas. Feeling near freezing in direct wind. |
| Freezing Level | Above the summits |

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

| How windy? (On the Munros) | Southerly 40-50mph, some stronger gusts over highest tops. | Southwesterly 25-35mph. Some risk of much stronger peak winds; detail uncertain. |
| Effect of wind on you? | Arduous walking likely all day. Buffeting gusts over tops may require crouching for stability. Significant wind chill. | Comfortable walking impacted, though some risk of arduous conditions more widely. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Local showers, later more extensive Local showery spots for much of morning. Rain setting in more widely through afternoon from the west. Risk spots of heavy/thunderly rain towards central highlands later. | Showers, frequent and heavy at times Showers drift in from the west, at times grouping together in broader, heavier bursts with risk of hail/thunder. Showers more scattered east of A9. |
| Cloud on the hills? | Becoming extensive Patchy cloud at various elevations from dawn, most broken with some clear summits from Schiehallion towards Ben Alder. Filling in extensively from middle slopes up as rain arrives. | Often foggy on high ground, breaks east Fairly extensive over tops near Loch Tay with patches to middle slopes. More broken east of A9 with breaks to tops around Glenshee. Variable as showers come and go, filling in extensively over high ground at times. |
| Chance of cloud free Munros? | 40%, lowering to 10% | 40%, lowering to 20% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Little or no sunshine. Good visibility in the morning, becoming poor as rain and cloud set in. | Patchy sunshine between fair weather cloud - may be largely cloudy for hours at a time. Excellent visibility. |
| How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level | 7 or 8C. Feeling like -3C in strongest wind. Above the summits | 5 or 6C. A slight rise possible on Angus and east of Glenshee. Feeling like -5C in exposure, through risk much cooler. Above the summits |

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 10 September, 2025

Low pressure over the north Atlantic dominates the weather pattern for the week ahead, maintaining unsettled conditions. West to southwesterly winds prevail bringing frequent rain and cloud to western areas, regularly becoming more widespread as weather features come and go. Breaks may form with some bursts of sunshine, though likely short lived. Early indications suggest a deeper area of low pressure late weekend and early next week will bring widespread gales, possibly severe on highest terrain. Becoming more mixed after mid-month with longer periods of dry weather, but a persistent southwesterly regime will continue to draw unsettled spells of weather into Britain, notably in the north.

Forecast issued at 16:15 on Monday, 8 September, 2025
