

Southeastern Highlands

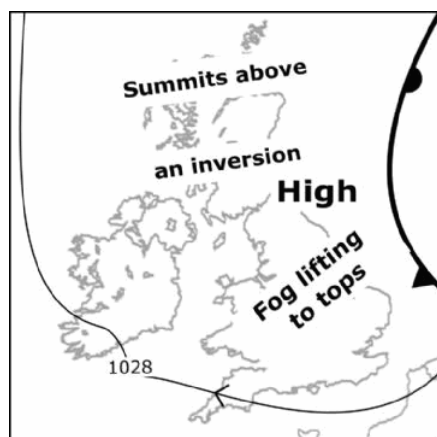
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Monday, 13 October, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 October, 2025

Inversion conditions widely across Scottish highlands. High tops of Lakeland and Snowdonia also likely above a cloud layer. Feeling quite warm in the autumn sunshine on summits above the cloud; valleys and glens starting cooler. Cloudier over Pennines and east Wales, most fog rising to high terrain with local breaks.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Low fog in the morning gradually clears; warm sunshine

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 13 October, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Generally west-southwesterly but variable, 10-15mph but often less. Some gusts may form at all heights.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain
Cloud on the hills?	Morning low fog gradually clears Dawn fog in the glens, the fog layer more sheet-like towards the central lowlands. Lifting somewhat after sunrise and breaking, unlikely to reach above 700m before becoming well-broken. Central highlands becoming substantially clear. High terrain above the cloud layer.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	90% (summits above cloud)
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely sunny above the cloud layer. Excellent visibility, some low level haze around eastern lowlands.
How Cold? (at 900m)	12C; glens starting much cooler inland. Feeling warm in the sunshine where temperatures may rise several degrees.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the Munros)	West to northwesterly or variable, 10mph or less, rare gusts 15mph.	Generally northerly though variable 10mph or less. Locally gusty at all elevations.
Effect of wind on you?	Small	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Patchy cloud banks, tops above inversion Cloud banks around some mid to upper slopes, most likely toward east. Also fog around some glens and lochs at first. Higher Munros likely above a cloud layer. Some areas largely clear all day, best chance central highlands.	Well-broken cloud lifts to high terrain Well-broken cloud at various heights in the morning, including in the glens, high tops likely above the cloud layer. Bases will rise to higher terrain, remaining broken for regularly or frequently exposed tops.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	70% (above top of a cloud layer)	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A good amount of sunshine, particularly on higher tops in very clear air above an inversion. Some misty areas lower down early in day, hazy south.	Patchy sunshine becomes more frequent on lower slopes as cloud base lifts. Very clear air over the tops, some haze lower down.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	7 to 9C, small variation from lower slopes upward in morning; highest tops warmer than mid-heights all day. Above the summits. Possible slight frost in glens at dawn.	6 to 8C, warmer on summits above cloud layer. East of A9 perhaps cooler. Cool in the glens at dawn. Above the summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 14 October, 2025**

High pressure resides over the country through the week, maintaining quiet weather. In the mornings, varied low cloud and morning fog is likely while inversion conditions likely to remain over highest mountains for several days. A haze will linger on low slopes below the inversion. During midweek the inversion starts to weaken as pressure begins to fall gradually; cloud will be well-broken for many and begin to lift to higher terrain. Light winds overall, an easterly breeze likely for Wales.

Uncertainty about the weather pattern development toward next weekend: some indication of strengthening winds bringing some rain, but may not reach all areas. Later October has hints of chillier northerly air, especially in Scotland.

Forecast issued at 16:00 on Sunday, 12 October, 2025
