

Southeastern Highlands

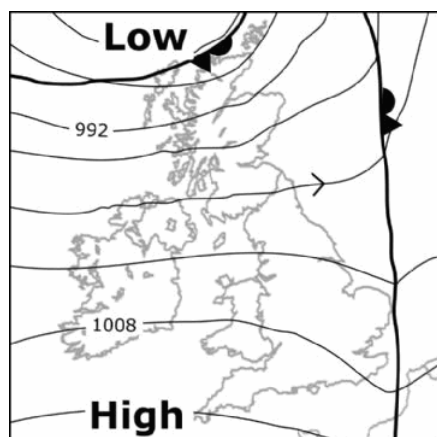
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Sunday, 2 November, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 2 November, 2025

Showery westerly winds, reaching gale force Scottish Highlands where cold enough for snow on higher tops. The rain will be almost constant NW Highlands, whilst from southern Scotland southward, showers will become well scattered. Least windy south Wales.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Gales higher slopes. Showers. Cold.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 2 November, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Southwesterly 45mph most of daylight, may locally reach 55mph over high tops central highlands. South of Perth 35 or 40mph. Difficult walking most of the day; balance and mobility in direct wind likely requires crouching at times. Significant wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain, most frequent west of A9. Snow higher tops. Showery rain frequent west of A9. Elsewhere the showers less frequent - particularly Angus and Ochils. Sleet or snow higher slopes, will lie above about 1150m.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Mountains extensively cloud covered; highest base Ochils and Angus Typical cloud base varying between 500 and 800m, although on Ochils and near and east of Glenshee, most cloud above 750m, perhaps breaks to higher tops. 10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bursts of sunshine toward central belt and Angus where often excellent visibility. Otherwise, often misty due to rain.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	Typically 3C. Will feel as cold as minus 11C directly in the wind. 1050m rising to 1200m.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Monday 3 November	Tuesday 4 November
How windy? (On the Munros)	Southwesterly 45-55mph. Gusty over high terrain, up to 60mph.	South to higher up southwesterly 40 to 50mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Widely difficult walking - in places any mobility a struggle - significant wind chill.	Continued difficult conditions where exposed on higher areas, where wind chill significant and walking a struggle.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Frequent or almost constant rain Rain most of day, although on and off Ochils and Angus, where total rainfall small.	Frequent or persistent rain. Rain or frequent showers most of all day.
Cloud on the hills?	Very extensive and low Fog persistently shrouding the mountains, widely from 400-450m up. Breaks higher near and east of Glenshee and Ochils, but the base rarely above 750m.	Mountains persistently foggy Widely persistent fog above 400 to 600m, perhaps 800m Ochils and near and east of Glenshee (confidence low).
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Almost nil	10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Dull and misty. Poor visibility in rain.	Glimpses of sun, mainly lower slopes Angus and Ochils. Otherwise, mostly dull and misty.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	8C. Will feel as cold as minus 5C directly in the wind. Above the summits	8C Will feel as cold as minus 4C directly in the wind. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 3 November, 2025

A series of deep Atlantic lows and associated fronts will continue to cross Britain over the next week to ten days. Frequently windy, and high rainfall, particularly on western mountains (rain at some stage almost daily) and cloud will frequently cover higher areas. Only rarely cold enough for snow higher mountains in Scotland.

Forecast issued at 12:34 on Saturday, 1 November, 2025
