
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Monday, 3 November, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 3 November, 2025

Gale to, in places, severe gale force south-westerlies will drive in very extensive low cloud across the hills and rainfall. The rain will be near constant across western mountains, and on and off across eastern areas. Significant wind chill.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Severe south-westerly gales with frequent rainfall and very extensive low cloud.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 3 November, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southwesterly 50 to 60mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Widely difficult walking - in places any mobility a struggle - significant wind chill.	
How wet?	Frequent or almost constant rain	
(Precipitation and its impact)	Rain most or day, although on and off Ochils and Angus, where total rainfall small.	
Cloud on the hills?	Very extensive and low	
	Fog persistently shrouding the mountains, widely from 400-450m up. Breaks higher near and east of Glenshee and Ochils, but the base rarely above 750m.

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Dull and misty. Poor visibility in rain.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	8C. Will feel as cold as minus 5C directly in the wind.

How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	South to higher up southwesterly 40 to 50mph. Continued difficult conditions where exposed on higher areas, where wind chill significant and walking a struggle.	Variable wind directions are expected, often 10-15mph or less, but may lift to become southerly 15 to 20mph later. Mostly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Frequent or persistent rain.	Frequent rain, but tending to ease.
	Rain or frequent showers most or all day.	Frequent pulses of rain in morning, some heavy. Tending to ease off in the afternoon to leave a footprint of patches of drizzle leftover.
Cloud on the hills?	Mountains persistently foggy	Widespread and to very low bases
	Widely persistent fog above 400 to 600m, perhaps 800m Ochils and near and east of Glenshee (confidence low).	Low cloud will blanket the hills in fog, down to the very lowest slopes across southern ranges.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 4 November, 2025

Remaining very unsettled with as a series of deep Atlantic lows, and their associated fronts, continue to cross Britain over the next week to ten days. Frequently windy, with high rainfall, particularly on western mountains (rain at some stage almost daily) and cloud will frequently cover higher areas. Only rarely cold enough for snow higher mountains in Scotland.
