

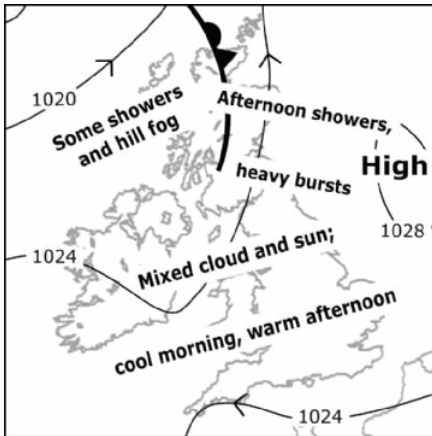
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.

## General Summary for Sunday, 26 April, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 26 April, 2026**

Showers in Scotland spread east, turning heavy afternoon. Fog lowering to high terrain in the west Highlands, becoming cooler here. Patchy dawn mist England and Wales, a broader low layer of sea fog east of the Pennines, lifting for clear hills; risk of a few late showers in north England. A cool start, becoming mild.

Early fog lifts above summits; afternoon showers

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 26 April, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	South-southwesterly 10-15mph; some variability and trending westerly with time. Some gustiness, not just on high terrain.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small, though some local gusty spots, and not just on high terrain.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Scattered showers, risk more frequent and heavy afternoon</b> Scattered showers with dry periods, then risk of a larger cluster of showers forming through afternoon with a risk of heavy bursts.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive early, rising above the summits</b> Variable banks of cloud at all heights in the morning, locally more extensive; high summits may be near the top of the cloud layer. Through morning, cloud lifts and gradually breaks, Munros largely clear afternoon, odd caps where showers occur.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>40% rising to 80%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Patchy sunshine, sometimes weakened by high cloud, which may thicken for periods. Very good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	3 or 4C, rising to 7 or 8C, mildest east where may approach 9C east of Glenshee/Angus hills.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits. A chance of patchy light frosts in some eastern glens and carries.

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Monday 27 April	Tuesday 28 April
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Variable, generally northerly, 10-15mph, lower speeds at times too. Strong gusts around afternoon showers.  <b>Fairly small, though occasional inconvenient gusts over high terrain, strongest afternoon.</b>	Northerly or variable, around 10mph, often lower.  <b>Negligible.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Showers and drizzle</b> Showers come and go most of the day, drizzle on high terrain even between showers. An increasing risk of heavy bursts towards the eastern lowlands later.	<b>Any rain unlikely</b> Small chance of odd spots of light rain in the east early in the day, but likely entirely dry.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Variable over high terrain, summit breaks</b> Variable banks at various heights in the morning, well-broken, and bases soon lifting largely to high tops, and regular summit breaks into the afternoon. Where showers occur afternoon, bases lower towards 900m.  <b>70%</b>	<b>Fairly extensive, lifting above summits</b> Fairly extensive from dawn, the fog layer possibly to lower slopes near the eastern lowlands. Lifting through morning and breaking, likely clearing summits through afternoon.  <b>30% rising to 80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun. Variable visibility, poor in cloud and rain but excellent during breaks.	Patchy sunshine breaking out, more often sunny afternoon.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	4C rising to 7C, or 8C central highlands. Suddenly lowering several degrees around showers.  Above the summits.	4C rising to 11C central highlands, cooler towards eastern lowlands, locally 8 or 9C.  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 27 April, 2026

Monday is likely showery, risk heavy with lightning in England. An easterly wind then gradually establishes in England and Wales, chilly nights and mornings with patchy dawn mist and light frosts, this soon fading for warm days. High pressure remains dominant through the week: regularly sunny and pleasantly warm days; summit temperatures often at or above 10C, many valleys will warm toward 20C or higher afternoon. Risk of sunburn in strong sunshine and very dry springtime ground conditions with high risk of wildfire.

Detail becomes uncertain into next weekend, but a rising risk of showers and longer spells of rain, mostly England and Wales, and likely turning cooler into the following week as wind shifts northerly.
