

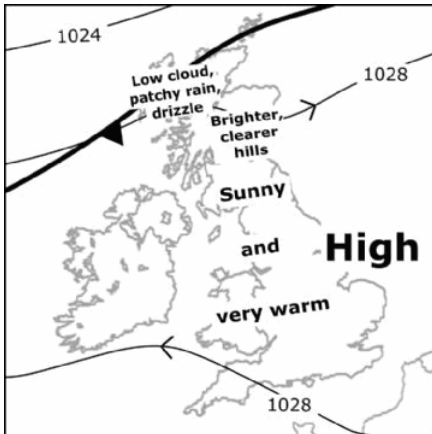
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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## General Summary for Monday, 25 May, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 25 May, 2026**

High pressure brings another extensively sunny and unseasonably hot day for England and Wales, with valley temperatures from Peak District into Wales up to 30C in afternoon. Also very warm sunshine southern and eastern Scotland, but still blustery south-westerly with low cloud and patchy drizzly rain northwest Scotland.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Blustery, mostly dry with cloud lifting off hills with warm sunshine. Best in east.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 25 May, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	South-westerly 15 to 25mph, generally strongest in the morning when perhaps briefly touching 30mph over tops.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small, but marked buffeting some tops through the morning.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>No rain expected</b> Very likely dry.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Lifting and breaking off the tops</b> May well be patches of banks capping tops for a time in the morning, especially toward western hills. By afternoon, most cloud breaking above the tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Lifting to 80%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Cloud layers thinning and breaking to reveal spells of sunshine. Visibility very good or excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	10 to 13C, highest in the east where locally may reach 14C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	<b>Tuesday 26 May</b>	<b>Wednesday 27 May</b>
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Westerly 10 to 20mph at first, but soon easing down to become 5 to 10mph and often varying in direction by afternoon. <b>Blustery start, but soon becoming negligible as the winds drop out.</b>	Varying in direction, or very weak southerly, 5 to 10mph, but perhaps flat calm for periods. <b>Negligible</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>	<b>Mostly dry</b> Risk of spots of drizzle where in low cloud.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Soon clear</b>  Any early patches or caps of cloud over the tops, will soon disperse leaving the mountains clear.  <b>90%</b>	<b>Low cloud largely dispersing</b>  Areas of low cloud from lower to mid slopes; upper slopes poking clear above. The low cloud will tend to disperse, leaving all slopes clear afternoon.  <b>50% lifting to 80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine coming through widely, most extensive in the east. Visibility very good or excellent.	Sunshine at first, mainly in far west and over the upper slopes. Expanding to all slopes by afternoon. Visibility good or very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	5 or 6C at dawn, lifting hour by hour to 8 to 11C by mid afternoon.  Above the summits	7C lifting to 10 to 12C, highest westernmost hills.  Well above the summits

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 26 May, 2026**

High pressure dominates this week with early patchy low cloud, mainly coastal hills dispersing to give widespread warm or very warm sunshine, still reaching into the high 20s on Tuesday Peak District into Wales with high humidity, which may spark off the odd thunderstorm, before peak daytime temperatures come down a little, when cooler for eastern hills. Chance of well scattered shower development from midweek as a gusty south-easterly develops for western hills. Pressure lowering next weekend into next week.
