

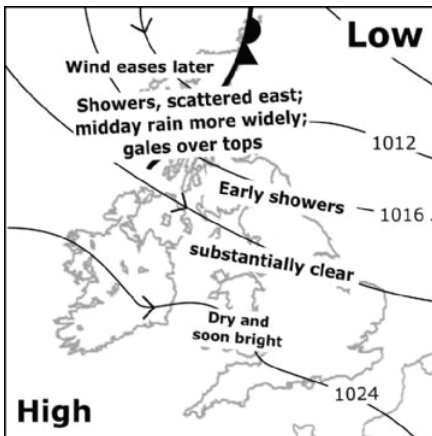
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Saturday, 13 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 June, 2026

Chilly and showery west Scottish highlands, fewer showers east but several afternoon hours of more widespread rain, later easing. Some early showers from south Scotland to north Wales, largely fading with sun breaks; south Wales is dry and brighter. Strong wind widely, easing Wales and north Scotland.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Momentary gales over tops; some showers, rainier afternoon

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 13 June, 2026

<p>How windy? (On the Munros)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>West-northwesterly 35-45mph, strongest gusts occasionally approaching 50mph over highest tops. Steadily northwesterly later in the day, some variability, and may ease slightly as night falls.</p> <p>Arduous walking over the high tops with significant wind chill likely all day. Maintaining stability requires sustained effort.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Showery rain, setting in for a time afternoon</p> <p>Rain drifting from the northwest for much of the day, some more persistent falls possible near Loch Ericht. Rain sets in more widely for several afternoon hours, always driest towards Ochil hills. Easing later, mostly dry near Loch Tay by evening, east of Glenshee slowest to clear.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free Munros?</p>	<p>Mostly just tops, more extensive afternoon</p> <p>Banks over the high tops likely from dawn, best chance of breaks east of the A9; more sheet-like cloud towards central highlands with bases to 800m. Summits east of A9 will see increasing breaks through morning, but cloud fills in more extensively for several afternoon hours, only later breaking.</p> <p>50%, deteriorating to 20% afternoon</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Bursts of sunshine, particularly lower slopes eastern areas, then several overcast hours afternoon.</p> <p>Very good visibility out of cloud and rain.</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 900m)</p> <p>Freezing Level</p>	<p>5 or 6C, rising to 7C.</p> <p>Feeling as cold as -5 to -7C in direct wind.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Northwesterly 15-20mph dawn, may gust 30mph east. Shifting northerly and easing to 10-15mph, largely 10mph or less later. Mostly small, some early gustiness in exposure.	Variable 10mph or less, orienting east-southeasterly and rising to 10-15mph afternoon, some variability. Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little or no rain A few spots of drizzle drifting onto Munros from the north, areas south of Loch Rannoch/Pitlochry entirely dry, and afternoon widely dry.	Dry most of daylight Late in the day, some patchy rain approaches from the southwest, but most Munros stay dry until nighttime when rain may become more frequent.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Likely clearing Banks of cloud above 800m at dawn, the summits probably shrouded to start, but cloud soon lifts and begins breaking up, the summits probably clear of cloud from midday onward; caps linger longest near Glenshee. Rising to 90%	Largely clear until later Some uncertainty, but banks of cloud at various heights in the morning, perhaps extensive, and including into glens and corries. Much of this cloud lifts, dissipating through morning for clear Munros. Later afternoon, a rising risk of a sheet of cloud encroaching from the southwest. 80%, later deteriorating
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Increasingly sunny, some thin high cloud to the south. Very good visibility.	Becoming mostly sunny, high cloud thickening through afternoon. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	5C rising to 10 or 11C; a degree cooler near and east of Glenshee. Above the summits.	6 or 7C at dawn, rising to 9 or 10C. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 14 June, 2026

Sunday will be a clearing day for most under a core of high pressure: early rain in Scottish Highlands easing, most cloud lifting off all hills except the north of Scotland, and good sunshine through weakened by high cloud. Temperature more widely mild, warm in Wales. Into next week, a mixed southwesterly pattern remains, windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. Warmest in England and Wales, but may stay cooler in Scotland as low pressure to the northwest recycles air from the north Atlantic back onto the Munros. Tuesday into Wednesday shows indications of a wetter and windier spell. Pressure generally trending higher later in the week, but extensively settled weather remains elusive until at least the following week.
