

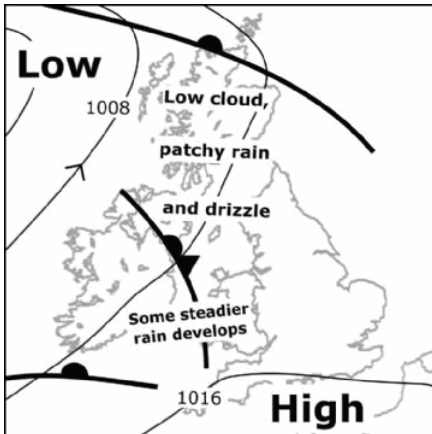
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Tuesday, 16 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 16 June, 2026

Damp southerly air will cloak many hills in low cloud, plus drizzle or a little rain. Highest cloud bases and best chance for breaks further northward. Moderate winds, more blustery near west coasts, strengthening for Wales where frequent rain arriving.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Increasing breeze. Generally damp, low cloud.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 16 June, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	South or southeasterly 15-20mph, trending higher with time, gusts to 25-30mph over high summits afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small for a time, but increasingly blustery, ease of walking affected in exposure and feeling chilly.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Patchy rain, drizzle, wetter later Light rain from dawn leaving drizzle into morning. Amounting to little for several midday hours, but always a risk of light patchy drizzle particularly drifting onto eastern hills. Later, more frequent falls return from southwest, some heavier.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive All hills shrouded above 600-700m all day, lower bases in the morning, to some lower slopes in south. Some brief higher breaks north of Loch Rannoch to Glenshee afternoon, but then returning widely extensively into evening.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Below 10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast, generally dull. Poor visibility across hills due to fog.
How Cold? (at 900m)	6C rising to 9C. Feeling like +1 to 3C in direct wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Wednesday 17 June	Thursday 18 June
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Southwesterly 20 to 30mph, tending to rise; in places stronger gusts around highest summits afternoon. Fairly small in places, but some blustery slopes, may make walking more strenuous on exposed high terrain.	South-southwesterly 20 to 30mph, occasional stronger gusts around tops. Risk strengthening into night. Starting to affect comfortable walking over higher exposed tops and ridges.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Intermittent rain Patchy rain, more frequent rain central highlands for periods, some showery rain mixed in passing eastwards. Drier more often southeast from Glenshee.	Patchy rain and drizzle Often damp across central highlands, patchy rain, some pulses of steadier rain extending northward, odd bursts of rain, generally less furthest east.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Most persistent west, may improve Fairly extensive over hills in rain. The most persistent cloud near Callander, to 600m around rain. Often capping most hills west of A9 to 800-900m, higher eastward. Rising afternoon, some breaks forming. 30%	Fairly extensive Shrouding much high terrain all day, to some mid-slopes in Callander area fairly persistently. Higher cloud base north and eastward, some breaks above 800m. 20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy, glimpses of sun, mainly eastern areas. Visibility very good, but reduced at times around rain.	Largely cloudy, brighter eastward. Visibility good below cloud, best near/east of A9, often mistier toward Trossachs.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	8C rising to 11C out of cloud in afternoon. Feeling near to freezing directly in wind. Above the summits.	8C, rising to 10C out of cloud, mainly eastern areas. Feeling near 0C in stronger wind. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 17 June, 2026

Humid southwesterly winds continue to prevail later this week, likely reaching gale-force over hills for a period Thursday into Friday, soonest in Wales. Periods of rain, some heavy, mixed with drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. More uncertainty of day-to-day detail in the extended range, but in general a variable southwesterly pattern continues; rain and low cloud common in western Scotland into next week. Some warmer days, drier more often England and Wales.

Forecast issued at 16:28 on Monday, 15 June, 2026
