

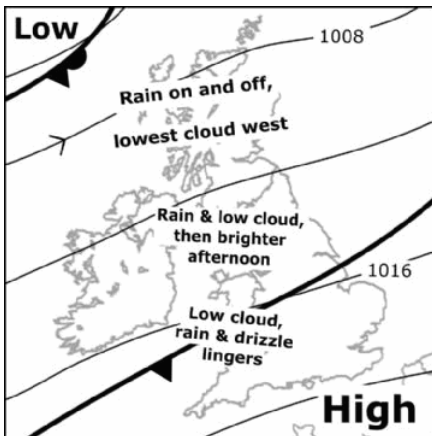
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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## General Summary for Wednesday, 17 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 17 June, 2026**

Southwesterly winds will be fresh to strong over the mountains. Rain widely fairly persistent in the morning, more showery for Scotland into afternoon, fading for northern England and Wales, but patchy rain lingers in south Wales. Cloud shrouding most high terrain, lowest in west, some breaks afternoon.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Increasingly breezy. Rain then showers, cloud base rising.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 17 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Southwesterly 15-25mph in morning, strongest near central belt, rising more widely into afternoon, in places 30mph with stronger gusts on higher tops.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small in places in morning, but some blustery slopes, by afternoon more often making walking more strenuous on exposed high terrain. Feeling cool in exposure.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Wettest in morning, then scattered showers</b> Rain persistent and fairly widely heavy early morning, pushing eastwards, fading from west, breaking up into middle of day. Then a few showers, drier intervals afternoon, but odd heavier showers drifting northeastward through afternoon-evening.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Most persistent in morning, rising into afternoon</b> Fairly extensive over hills in morning rain, the most persistent cloud near Callander, to 600m. Often capping most hills west of A9 to 800-900m then rising afternoon, some breaks forming, best above 1000m eastern hills.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>20%, rising to 50% east.</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Fairly cloudy, glimpses of sun, mainly eastern areas. Visibility poor in early rain and cloud, improving to become very good away from showers.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	8C rising to 11C out of cloud in afternoon. Feeling near to freezing directly in wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 18 June	Friday 19 June
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	South-southwesterly 20 to 30mph, occasional stronger gusts around tops. Then risk strengthening later in night. <b>Starting to affect comfortable walking over higher exposed tops and ridges.</b>	South-southwesterly, rising from before dawn to 40-55mph, gusts 65-70mph high tops; lessening only late in day. <b>Challenging walking, sudden buffeting on downslopes to north, gusts may knock you over on tops. Considerable wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain most frequent west</b> Often damp across central highlands, steady rain for periods, pulses of rain extending northeastward, odd bursts of rain, generally less furthest east.	<b>Frequent heavy or thundery rain</b> Bursts of rain extending northwards from overnight into morning, further pulses of rain likely into afternoon; some more constant heavy or torrential falls. Risk of thunder. May start to fade later from west.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive</b>  Shrouding much high terrain all day, to some mid-slopes in Callander area fairly persistently. Higher cloud base north and eastward, some breaks above 800m.	<b>Fairly extensive, varied</b>  Covering most high terrain, lowest cloud banks on southern slopes, persistent much of day in places. Some local breaks possible, but filling in and lowering widely in rain, ragged patches to lower slopes.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>20%</b>	<b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, brighter eastward. Visibility good below cloud, best near/east of A9, often mistier toward Trossachs.	Any sun weak through high cloud, largely overcast. Visibility good where dry, but a haze likely, murkier around rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b> <b>Freezing Level</b>	8C, rising to 10C out of cloud, mainly eastern areas. Feeling near 0C in stronger wind. Above the summits.	Humid 11 to 13C, then toward/after dusk may drop rapidly to 6C. Feeling below freezing in wind all day. Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 18 June, 2026

Humid southwesterly winds persist late this week, reaching gale-force over hills - affecting northern England and Wales on Thursday, then Scotland by Friday. Periods of rain, some heavy falls with possible thundery bursts mixed in. Low cloud most persistent in the west. Less windy, but still breezy into Saturday in Scotland, feeling less humid for most, but western Scottish hills at least stay cloud capped and with showery rain. Sunday is more uncertain, but a risk of some further rain pushing in from the southwest - warmer again over England and Wales. A mixed west-southwesterly pattern into next week, rain and low cloud most common in western Scotland, drier with higher cloud eastwards and more often dry for England & Wales. Near average temperatures, may rise late week in south.
