

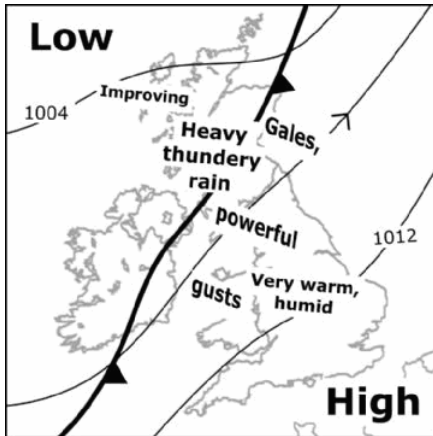
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Friday, 19 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 19 June, 2026

A swathe of heavy rain extends across the Highlands, southern Scotland then into Cumbria and west Wales, some torrential bursts, thunder and lightning possible. A belt of gale-force upland winds just ahead of the rain. Warm and humid. Winds ease in western Scotland, rain fades, cloud lifts, dropping cooler.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Heavy rain, setting in at times. Low cloud. Gales mainly morning.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 19 June, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	South-southwesterly, some marked variations, but for several hours in morning 40 to 50mph, gusts over 60mph high tops, particularly eastern areas. Lessening from west afternoon to 20-30mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Difficult conditions for a few hours at least, challenging walking, sudden buffeting on downslopes to north, gusts may knock you over on tops. Considerable wind chill. Moderating to smaller effects during day.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Heavy thundery rain for periods Bursts of rain extending northwards from overnight into morning, some more constant heavy or torrential falls. Risk of thunder. May ease off for periods during afternoon, but risk pulses of heavy rain may return from south into evening.
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive, varied Covering most high terrain, lowest cloud banks on southern slopes, persistent much of day in places. Some local breaks possible, but filling in and lowering widely in rain, ragged patches to lower slopes.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Little if any sun. Hazy, murkier for periods.
How Cold? (at 900m)	Humid 11C; then into night dropping to 7C. Feeling below freezing in strongest wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Saturday 20 June	Sunday 21 June
How windy? (On the Munros)	Southwesterly 20 to 25mph, at times gusts 30mph higher tops.	Southwesterly 10 to 15mph in morning, dropping below 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, some more noticeable gusty spots at times. Feeling cool in exposure on high tops.	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Brief local showers One or two showers drifting eastwards morning into middle of day, but largely fading out into afternoon.	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly western areas in morning Fairly extensive cloud over central highlands west of the A9 in the morning, some banks to 600-700m for a time. Lifting above 900m during morning, then will increasingly thin and break to tops.	Little if any Brief patches of cloud around some slopes early morning, soon all dispersing, or cloud then forming above the summits.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30% rising to 80%	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy, some sun breaking through, best in eastern areas. Visibility very good below cloud.	Early sunshine then patchwork of cloud and sun as fair-weather cloud builds. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C rising to 9 or 10C afternoon. Feeling near 0C in the wind on tops.	7C at dawn, rising to 12C afternoon.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 20 June, 2026**

Cooler and less humid for Saturday, some showery rain and low cloud in the west, tending to improve. Sunday is a dry day for most with clearer hills, light winds and feeling warmer, becoming more humid again from the south. More uncertainty early next week - some rain possible for Scotland into Monday, potential scattered thunderstorms for England and Wales as it becomes very humid. A fresher westerly wind is indicated into Tuesday with some showers, then higher pressure likely expands over the country from the south midweek with drier weather then likely for a few days. Scope for higher temperatures and humidity to build toward next weekend, which may eventually break into thunderstorms.
