

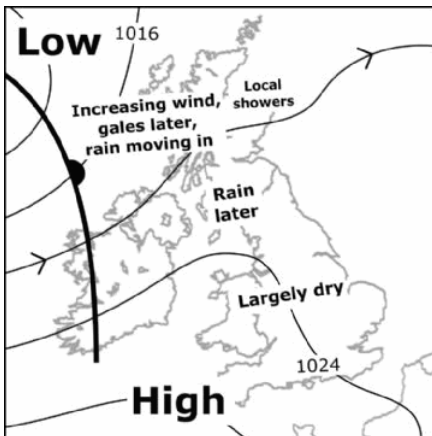
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.

## General Summary for Wednesday, 1 July, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 1 July, 2026**

Rapidly strengthening wind into the afternoon, gales develop increasingly widely later. Odd showers, then rain sweeps into western Scotland through the afternoon, setting in. England & Wales largely dry until evening. Cloud fairly widely on western hills in the morning, lifting for a time prior to rain.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Light wind early; deteriorating to gales and rain late in day.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 1 July, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Variable then southerly 10mph or less early in day, strengthening southwesterly afternoon 25-35mph, toward and into evening 50-60mph, soonest west; switching westerly into night, gusts to 70mph or stronger.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small in the morning, but becoming more blustery, walking increasingly arduous later, very difficult late in day, with considerable wind chill by evening. Severe conditions into overnight hours.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Rare showers, rain later in day</b> Generally dry until later in day, except for an odd isolated shower passing eastwards morning into middle of day. Toward evening, rain moving in from southwest, becoming persistent, some heavier late in day, soonest toward west. Persistent rain breaks up into showers overnight.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Varied in morning, lifting, breaks to tops</b> Banks of cloud over higher slopes and some patches to mid-levels in the morning. Tending to lift and break to upper slopes into middle of day, clearing some high tops afternoon, best toward and east of Glenshee. Lowering late in day over higher slopes from west as rain develops.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>30% rising to 70% afternoon until evening</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Patchwork of cloud and sun, giving way to high cloud moving in from west later, thickening toward evening. Visibility excellent below/out of cloud until late in day.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	8 or 9C, local 10C afternoon in east. Feeling like freezing as wind increases, later near -5C in exposure on tops.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 2 July	Friday 3 July
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Westerly, 70mph dawn-early morning, lessening to 40-50mph during morning, 25-35mph in afternoon, locally gusty east. <b>Severe conditions from overnight and still difficult well into daytime, walking and balance challenging, slowly moderating.</b>	Southwesterly 25 to 40mph, speeds likely to fluctuate during the day, reaching 50mph at least in gusts around highest tops. <b>Affecting comfortable walking, at times more strenuous on exposed terrain and balance may be challenging on ridges.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Scattered showers</b> Overnight rain likely clears to leave showery conditions, most frequent central highlands in morning, a scattering afternoon, becoming more often dry.	<b>A little rain mostly west</b> Occasional drizzle mainly over central hills west of the A9, some rain may develop at times. Very little if any east from Glenshee.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Lifting toward or above tops</b>  Covering high terrain fairly widely from dawn, soon mostly confined above 1000m and gradually tending to thin and break higher, best and soonest near/east of A9.	<b>Most persistent western tops</b>  Often covering higher slopes around Callander, more widely for periods above 800-1000m, but some breaks. More often clearing further eastwards.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>30% rising to 70%</b>	<b>20% furthest west, 40% east.</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun breaking through, most often eastern lower slopes. Visibility very good below cloud.	Glimpses of sun mostly east, toward Angus often sun through high cloud. Visibility good below cloud, very good east.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b> <b>Freezing Level</b>	6C rising to 8C afternoon. Directly in the stronger winds feeling like -5 to -10C on tops. Above the summits.	8C rising to 10C afternoon in east. Feeling like 0 to -3C directly in the wind. Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 2 July, 2026**

West to southwesterlies prevail across northern Britain. Rain, drizzle and low cloud most frequent over western hills from Lake District northward. Temperatures near average, but feeling cool in exposure to wind on tops. An improving trend from the south over the weekend as higher pressure builds, best conditions for Wales and eastern hills elsewhere. Drier and warmer conditions more likely into next week, very warm some days England and Wales, though southwesterlies still bring more cloud to western Scotland, some rain at times, wettest toward northwest.
