

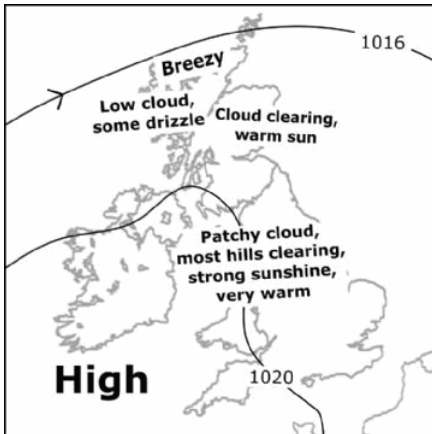
Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Wednesday, 8 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 8 July, 2026

Damp with blanket low cloud in W-NW Scotland, gusty locally. Highest Scottish tops may emerge above the cloud. Drizzle on western slopes easing, cloud thinning and breaking for central and southwest Scotland, sunnier and warmer overall in east. Very warm to hot sunshine for England & Wales.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Gusty early in day. Cloud in west clears, warm sun.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 8 July, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	West to southwesterly 15 to 20mph, some gusts 30mph in east mainly just after dawn for a few hours.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but some noticeable gustiness in places not just on high tops early in day.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Rare fine drizzle west-central highlands if in early low cloud on windward slopes.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied banks, slower to clear west, highest tops at times above cloud Banks of cloud around mid-slopes in morning, most extensive central highlands, toward Callander patches slow to clear above 800m into afternoon, but gradually thinning; largely clearing elsewhere by middle of day. High tops above 1100m may at least start above cloud, some patches drift higher before clearing.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30% rising to 60% west, 80% east.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Varied cloud and sun in morning, some misty slopes; then increasingly sunny with fair-weather cloud, best toward east; high UV, beware sunburn. Visibility good or increasingly very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	12C rising to 15C afternoon, locally 17C easternmost hills. (Eastern glens rising toward 25C afternoon).
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 9 July	Friday 10 July
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Southwesterly 15 to 25mph, some gusty spots around higher tops in the morning, tending to drop lighter with time. Mostly small, some more noticeable blustery areas mainly early in day.	Variable direction 10mph or less. Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Chance of a thunderstorm later Most places likely dry. Rare spots of rain possible from high cloud, mainly toward the west. Later in the day, chance of a local burst of rain almost anywhere, small risk of an isolated thundery downpour.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Mostly western hills and in morning Patchy cloud around some slopes early in day, most persistent west of A9; highest tops near or above top of cloud, then fog likely drifts up over western tops for a few hours. Tending to thin and break into afternoon, best eastwards. 50% west, to 80% eastern hills.	Most hills clear Some cloud banks may drift onto hills near Callander for periods, otherwise widely clear. If a late shower occurs, cloud patches forming at various levels. 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and broken cloud. Some varied mist central highlands early in day, then visibility very good out of cloud.	Some weak sun through a veil of high cloud, which may thicken across the sky. Visibility mostly very good, some early mist, then locally misty later if rain occurs.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	12C rising to 15 to 17C afternoon, warmest eastern areas. Feeling like 5C if exposed to stronger breeze early in day. Above the summits.	14C rising to 18C, very warm and rather humid. (Glens reaching 25C) Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 9 July, 2026

Increasingly warm for Scotland, hot for England and Wales this week. Southwesterly winds easing for much of Scotland but remnants of fronts bring further low cloud and drizzle to the west late this week. Locally a chance of thundery downpours in eastern Highlands later Friday, some of which may linger into Saturday but likely fading. A generally fine summertime outlook through the weekend and well into next week as high pressure expands northwards to broadly reside across Britain. Warm but generally pleasant summer temperatures next week. Sunshine and fair-weather cloud, many hills often clear. Easterly breezes for England and Wales.
