

Southeastern Highlands

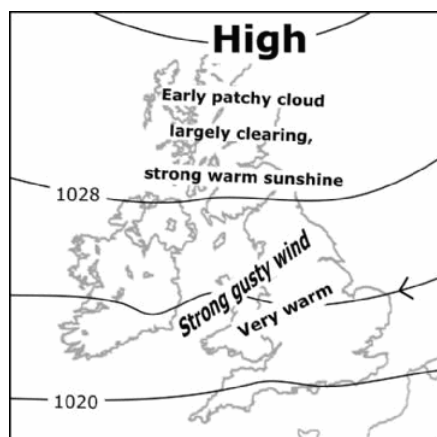
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Monday, 13 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 July, 2026

Varied banks of cloud around hills in Scotland and Pennines early in the day, but increasingly dispersing during the morning to leave most or all hills clear. Strong sunshine, pleasant temperatures, warmest in western areas. Mostly light wind for the Highlands, gusty easterly further south. Very warm for Wales.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Patchy cloud clears, warm sunshine, mostly light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 13 July, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	East-southeasterly, some variability, 10-15mph, strongest southern hills where gusty 20mph to middle slopes.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but nuisance gusts common southern hill groups.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Breaking into patchy banks, largely clearing Cloud banks fairly widely from dawn, most high tops near or just above the cloud layer. Soon after sunrise cloud begins lifting with breaks forming, just patchy banks on high terrain by mid-late morning, mostly all clearing.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A patchwork of cloud and sunshine, increasingly sunny. Very good visibility. High UV, beware sunburn.
How Cold? (at 900m)	9C rising to 13C, local 15C towards central highlands, (where some glens approach 25C by afternoon).
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly 10 to 20mph, typically strongest on hills nearer the central belt near Callander. Mostly small, some breezier spots mainly toward the south.	Easterly 5 to 15mph, local gusty 20mph on mountains nearer the central belt. Mostly small, locally feeling breezier around some southern hills.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Higher terrain clear From dawn, fog in some glens and mostly only lower hill slopes, brief fragments may drift upslope, but retreating eastward and dispersing during morning. Tops generally clear all day. Above 90%	Mountains clear From dawn, fog in some glens and on lowest hill slopes most widely toward the lowlands, thinning away to the North Sea. Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine and excellent visibility on hills, early mist lower down, leaving some low level haze.	Strong sunshine all day. Excellent visibility on high terrain, some low-level haze.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	14C from dawn (warmer than many lower slopes and glens), rising to 17C (central glens reach 25C). Above the summits.	16C from dawn (warmer than glens), rising to 19C (glens reach 25C). Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 14 July, 2026**

A fine week of summer weather - warm and dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. High pressure keeps the skies mostly clear, some low-level cloud rolling inland from the North Sea at times. A prevailing easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures for western hill groups, valley temperatures often 25C, or warmer for Wales and Peak District, at times 30C. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Notably dry ground conditions, beware very high fire risk. A cooling trend toward the weekend as north-northeasterly winds develop, a few showers possible, but a dry theme likely into early next week.
