

Southeastern Highlands

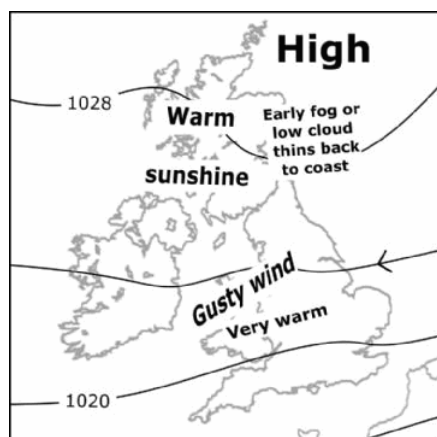
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Tuesday, 14 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 14 July, 2026

Dry with strong sunshine, warmest in west.

Early fog and low cloud over eastern hills retreats toward the North Sea in the morning. Gusty easterlies mainly central Scotland southwards, strongest for Wales.

Extremely dry ground conditions - beware high risk of fire.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Warm sunshine, early low fog, light wind, local gusts.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 14 July, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Easterly 10 to 20mph, typically strongest on hills nearer the central belt near Callander, some gusty spots.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, some breezier spots mainly toward the south.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Higher terrain clear, early low fog disperses From dawn, fog in some glens and fairly widely on lower hill slopes toward the lowlands, brief fragments may drift upslope, but mountains generally clear from mid-slopes upward. Fog retreating eastward, dispersing during morning.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Practically certain (above early fog)
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine and excellent visibility on hills, early fog lower down, most widely toward the lowlands, leaving some low level haze. High UV, beware sunburn.
How Cold? (at 900m)	14C from dawn (warmer than many lower slopes and glens above an inversion at first), rising to 17C (central glens reach 25C). Feeling fresher in the breeze.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	East or southeasterly 5 to 15mph, local occasional gusts 20mph on mountains nearer the central belt. Mostly small, locally feeling breezier around some southern hills.	East to northeasterly, 5 to 10mph, local gusts 15-20mph mainly hills nearest the central belt. Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Mountains clear From dawn, fog confined to glens and only lowest hill slopes most widely toward the lowlands; thinning away to the North Sea.	Hills clear Fog over the North Sea likely to have reached into the lowlands and some glens around dawn, soon retreating back to the coast. Hills widely clear.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Practically certain	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine all day. Excellent visibility on high terrain, some low-level haze.	Sunshine over the mountains dawn til dusk, occasional thin high cloud. Visibility excellent, some fog at first areas toward the lowlands, may leave a haze.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	16C from dawn (warmer than glens), rising to 19C (glens reach 25C). Above the summits.	16C from dawn, (warmer than glens at first), rising to 19C (central glens reach 25C). Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 15 July, 2026

Staying broadly fine likely through the weekend into early next week at least - dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. Some coastal fog rolling inland overnight for misty dawns in places this week.

Valley temperatures rising to 25C or above, typically warmer in Wales and Peak District. Gusty easterly winds for England and Wales. An ongoing very high risk of fire with extremely dry ground conditions. Into the weekend, northerly breezes develop more widely, a cooling trend for a time, particularly Scotland where summit temperatures likely dip back below 10C; some cloud may be drawn onto northern mountains at times, small chance of isolated showers.

Forecast issued at 16:00 on Monday, 13 July, 2026
