

Southeastern Highlands

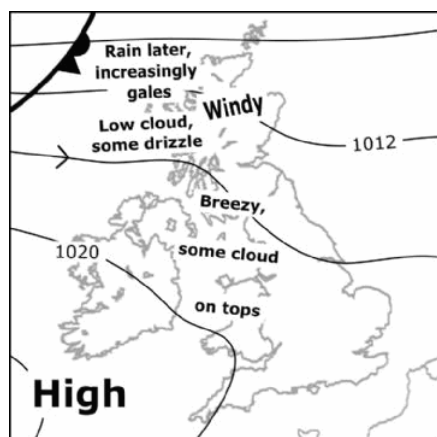

General Summary for Friday, 24 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 24 July, 2026

Strong westerly winds, reaching gale-force on Scottish tops, increasing later. Low cloud and some drizzle in western Scotland, drier and some cloud breaks further east. More persistent rain develops from the northwest later. Largely dry England & Wales, some cloud capping high western tops.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Windy, strengthening later. Patchy drizzle, cloud on tops west.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 24 July, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Westerly 25 to 35mph, gusts over 40mph in places around higher mountains. Tending to strengthen toward evening, reaching 50mph by dusk into night, gusts over 60mph higher mountains. Blustery over high terrain, affecting comfortable walking and balance in exposed places. Generally deteriorating toward dusk. Marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Occasional drizzle mostly west in morning Drizzle most common for western central highlands in the morning, drier into the afternoon. Patchier drizzle east, often dry all day Glenshee to Angus. Evening into night, some steadier rain develops from northwest.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Most persistent central tops, breaks east Covering hills from Callander to near the A9 much of the day above 800-1000m, some lower banks in morning. Some highest tops near top of the cloud banks at times. Higher bases and better breaks eastwards, particularly afternoon, clearing tops for periods. 30% west-central, to 60% furthest east.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy central highlands, visibility reduced in drizzle, otherwise good below cloud, some sun breaking through in east.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	8C rising to 10C west, to 13C eastern tops; little change with added height on Munros. Feeling near/below 0C directly in wind. Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 25 July, 2026

Westerly winds prevail this weekend and early next week, then southwesterly into midweek, bringing spells of rain, drizzle and some showery falls; low cloud persistent across hills, particularly in the west. Upland gales early on Saturday tend to lessen, but staying breezy; lower wind speeds for Scotland on Sunday. Rather cool this weekend and Monday, single-figures Celsius on high terrain. Then more humid, and warmer, especially England & Wales. More prolonged heavier rain possible for western Scotland Monday-Tuesday, risk of gales again on high tops. More uncertainty later in the week as a slow-moving area of low pressure is nearby, but risk areas of heavy rain and showers.

Forecast issued at 16:16 on Thursday, 23 July, 2026
