

Southeastern Highlands

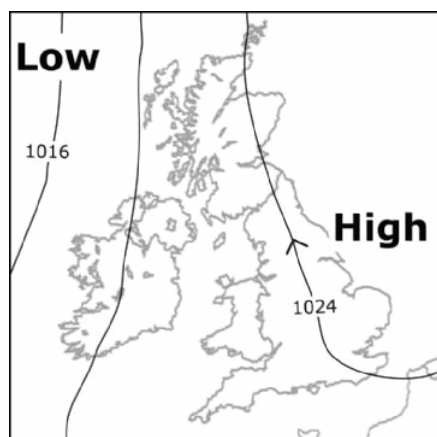
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Tuesday, 11 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 August, 2026

Fine and widely sunny - albeit patches of high thin cloud. In Scotland cloudy at times near west coast, whilst centred on the SE Highlands, persistent low cloud in the morning. Becoming very warm England and Wales.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Dry; sunshine after persistent low cloud morning.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 11 August, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southerly 10 to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive fog morning. Cloud base gradually rising and later clearing. In morning blanket of cloud above about 500m - there may be breaks or little at all near Ben Alder, and highest summits could be above the cloud. The cloud will slowly lift and disperse from late morning, although patches well into the afternoon near and east of Glenshee.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	10% slowly rising from northwest to reach 90% mid to late afternoon
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensively cloudy or dull morning; slowly from north and west sunshine developing, sometimes through high thin cloud. Excellent or superb visibility developing as cloud breaks.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C rising to 16C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Wednesday 12 August	Thursday 13 August
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Southerly increasing from around 10mph lower slopes to 30mph, locally 35mph on higher tops afternoon. Will increasingly impede ease of walking with height; sudden gusts, in places blowing downslope off higher terrain.	Southwesterly between 15 and on higher areas west of A9, 25mph. Mostly fairly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Extensively or completely dry Risk of the odd shower, raining from a few spots to a brief burst of heavier rain.	Rain occasionally; small risk thunder Occasional bursts of rain, possibly heavy rain (with risk thunder) west of A9. Elsewhere, bursts of rain only rarely - some areas having only a few spots, if any, all day.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Most or all summits cloud free Cloud covering higher tops at times, in morning patches, mainly west of A9 above 600 to 900m. In afternoon, patches slowly form across the region above 1000m, later 750m, perhaps 600m in places. 60%	Extensive on higher areas Conditions will vary, with breaks above 1050m, mainly toward and east of Glenshee. But particularly in and after rain, cloud forming near 750m, perhaps widely, and later from west patches forming below 600m. 20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Intermittent sunshine. Excellent visibility although slight haze.	Occasional sunshine, mainly east of A9. Hazy.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	11 rising to 16C. Above the summits.	17C Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 12 August, 2026

Chance of bursts of rain, possibly locally thundery on Wednesday NW England northwards, with further occasional rain (and low cloud) later in the week, mainly across the W & NW Highlands.

The almost completely dry and warm weather will persist elsewhere - very hot indeed Thursday. Underfoot conditions will remain exceptionally dry.

There may be little change in the pattern into next week - although there is uncertainty in the track of oncoming rain on low cloud at the end of the weekend.
