

Southeastern Highlands

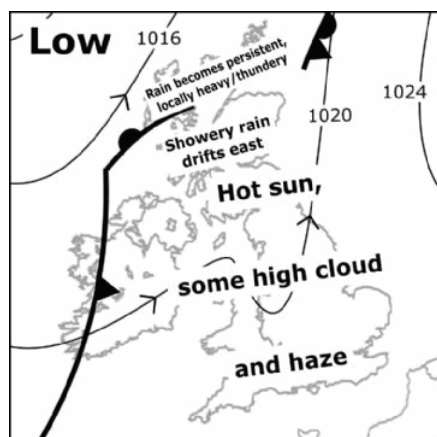
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Thursday, 13 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 August, 2026

Exceptionally hot in England and Wales, fire risk remains high. Despite haze and high cloud, beware sunburn and dehydration. Warm too in Scotland. Hill cloud and showery rain affects west Scotland from morning, patches spreading east; rain becomes frequent west Scotland later with heavy bursts.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Rising chance patchy rain afternoon; very warm

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 13 August, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southwesterly between 15 and on higher areas west of A9, 25mph. Some variability both above and below these speeds.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Most rain west, risk more widely afternoon Occasional bursts of rain, possibly heavy rain west of A9. Elsewhere, bursts of rain only rarely, but a risk of more frequent showers afternoon with a rumble of thunder towards central highlands.
Cloud on the hills?	Clear early, high terrain increasingly covered Through morning, most summits stay clear, the occasional cap grazing the tops, as low as 900m towards central highlands where rain occurs. With time, the tops will be more often capped, bases reaching to 700-800m in heavier bursts of rain, but still a chance of breaks east.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80% lowering to 40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny with good visibility in the morning; cloud increasingly shrouding the sun, just glimpses in the later afternoon. Visibility will vary as rain becomes more frequent.
How Cold? (at 900m)	15C rising to 17C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 14 August, 2026

Mixed conditions early next week with periods of rain and sunny bursts. High pressure remains present to the southwest of the British Isles, maintaining the possibility of drier brighter days; detail remains uncertain regarding risk of more unsettled weather. Temperatures likely nearer average.
