

Southeastern Highlands

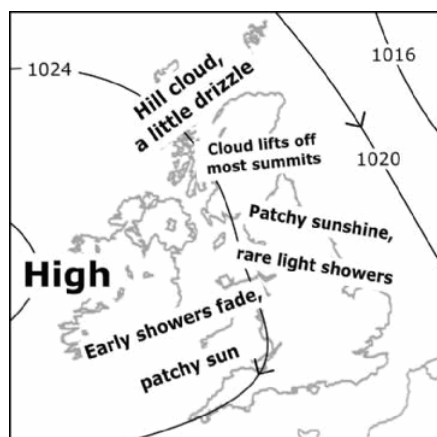
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Saturday, 22 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 22 August, 2026

Cloud clings to northwest Scotland slopes, a little drizzle. Cloud clears most other Munros, varied banks over highest summits. Rare showers in England but most hills dry, morning cloud lifting off summits with patchy sunshine. Early showers in north and west Wales will clear for patchy sun as well.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Blustery east early; cloud lifts off summits

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 22 August, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Northwesterly 10-20mph; quite gusty in the morning, strongest speeds east of Glenshee with strongest gusts approaching 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, though nuisance gusts increasingly over some high tops.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Lifting off summits Patchy cloud banks at varied heights in the morning, most cloud near Ben Lawers; hills south of Loch Tay may start largely clear. Cloud will lift, clearing the summits with time.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny though morning, some patchy cloud north, and a broader patchwork forming through afternoon. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	5C rising to 9 or 10C. Feeling below freezing in early wind over eastern summits.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 23 August, 2026

A core of high pressure drifts over the country on Sunday, bringing light and varied wind, dry weather, and minimal hill cloud fairly widely. Northwest Scotland will see a westerly breeze with a little drizzle and lingering hill cloud. It will feel warm in England and Wales in the sunshine, but fair weather cloud will tend to build in the afternoon. Monday is settled too, but high pressure slips away to the northwest, facilitating a southeasterly wind into Wales, later more widely. Tuesday sees a return of low pressure from the south: temperatures will rise and patchy rain will increasingly spread northward with some local stronger wind. Conditions likely continue to unsettle as next weekend approaches with bands of heavy rain forming, varied conditions continuing through the weekend, and likely staying warm and somewhat humid.
