

Southeastern Highlands

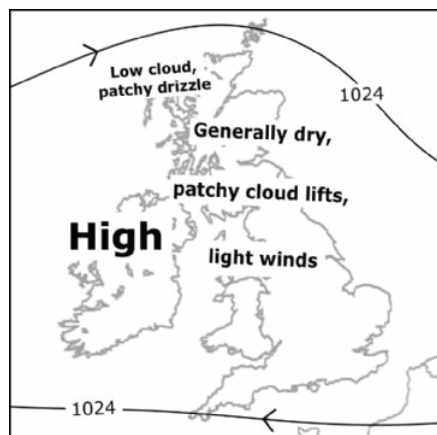
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Sunday, 23 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 23 August, 2026

A fine day for most places with light winds. Patchy cloud around some hill slopes early in the day will lift to leave many summits clear, but cloud banks are likely to persist on west coastal tops in Scotland, a little drizzle here in the morning, breezier too in the far northwest.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Patchy cloud lifts, many tops clear; generally dry.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 23 August, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Westerly locally 15mph from dawn but soon often 5 to 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Substantially dry Rare if any local pockets of drizzle early in the day. Chance of an isolated light shower in the afternoon, mainly toward east.
Cloud on the hills?	Some patches, rising above most tops Patchy cloud around some hill slopes and local mist lower down from dawn. Becoming confined to patches on some higher slopes above 1000m, but rising to largely clear the summits by midday.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	50% rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sun early in the day, tending to cloud over, then a little sun may return toward evening. Visibility very good out of cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C rising to 11C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Monday 24 August	Tuesday 25 August
How windy? (On the Munros)	Southerly trending southeasterly, 10-15mph.	Easterly 15 to 20mph, occasional 25mph on mountains mainly in Callander area.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.	Fairly small, locally feeling breezier and gusty around southernmost tops.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Drizzle on and off Drizzle in the air, may be frequent for periods making it generally damp, but small amounts of rain in total.
Cloud on the hills?	Soon largely clear At dawn, banks of cloud at varied heights, including into glens and many summits above cloud. Bases rise to clear the summits much of the day. As evening approaches, cloud lowers onto the tops and fills in as night falls, lowest in the east.	Fairly extensive, slowly breaking Varied cloud banks from lower slopes upward in the morning, some higher slopes may be briefly above cloud layers, but tending to drift higher up. Breaks forming, but patches likely come and go on tops.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80% well into the day	30% rising to 60% afternoon.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of cloud and sun. Very good visibility, some haze southernmost hills.	Fairly cloudy, may break up a little to give some sun, thin high cloud. Visibility very good below cloud, but some hills mistier for several hours.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C rising to 11C.	7C rising toward 10C, though eastern tops likely stay cooler.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 24 August, 2026

A fine start to the week with high pressure nearby, but easterly breezes will tend to strengthen. Most places dry through Monday and Tuesday, but generally deteriorating from the south into midweek as low pressure moves in from the south, patchy rain will increasingly spread northward with some local stronger wind. Broadly unsettled as next weekend approaches with bands of heavy rain forming mixed with showery bursts at times, but fairly warm and somewhat humid. Wind speed and direction likely to vary considerably day-to-day.
