

Southeastern Highlands

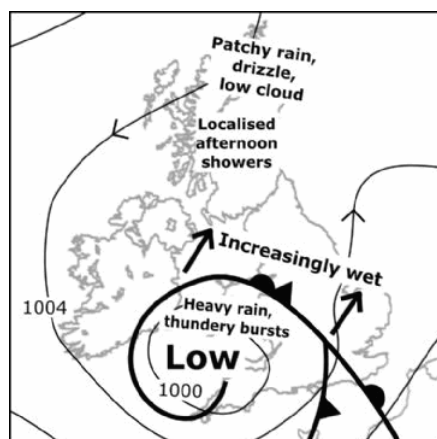
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Saturday, 29 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 29 August, 2026

Northerly winds bring cloud and some light rain to northern Scotland, but winds fall light for much of the Highlands - varied low cloud banks tend to rise, isolated showers possible afternoon. Rain for Wales from early morning, extending further north over England during the day, often heavy, risk thunder.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Light wind. Varied cloud breaks; risk local showers later.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 29 August, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Northwesterly 15mph early morning, local 20mph or stronger gusts eastern areas from dawn. Soon easing, mostly below 10mph by mid-late morning onward.
Effect of wind on you?	Feeling cool if on high tops at first, otherwise negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Mostly dry, then possible showery rain later Rare fine drizzle locally around early cloud banks, otherwise substantially dry over many hours. Later in afternoon onward, odd showery rain forming, risk heavier bursts into evening, possibly a local cluster of rain forming late in day.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied over high terrain, some breaks Patchy cloud above 500-600m early, varied with some high slopes between or above banks for a time. A lifting trend, breaking up somewhat with summit breaks for several hours at least. Returning over tops if showers form, may then fill in locally during evening.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	50% rising to 80% through middle of day
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sunshine, tending to cloud over. Visibility generally very good, reducing later in day if showery rain occurs.
How Cold? (at 900m)	9 or 10C, rising towards 12C afternoon.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 30 August, 2026

A generally unsettled outlook through the extended weekend and into the start of September with frequent rain and strong winds. Areas of low pressure and frontal systems move in from the Atlantic . Dropping cooler, notably chilly over Scottish mountains into Tuesday, close to freezing point on highest summits with significant wind chill in strong westerlies. A brief window of better conditions into Wednesday soon deteriorates from the west as southwesterly winds strengthen , reaching gale force over the mountains frequently in the second half of the week. Heavy rain most prolonged in the west where increasingly wet underfoot. Likely staying unsettled into next weekend and the following week.

Forecast issued at 16:29 on Friday, 28 August, 2026
