

Southeastern Highlands

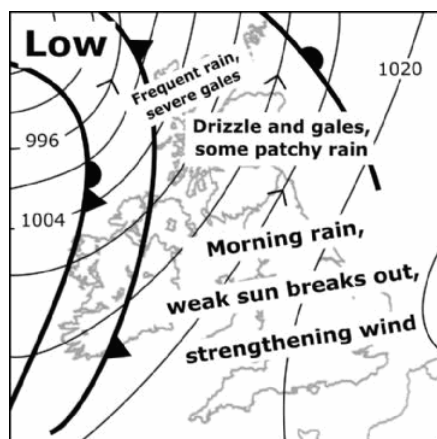
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Sunday, 6 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 6 September, 2026

Gales spread widely across Scotland, severe over high north and west tops. Drizzle over the Highlands, rainy early and late, wettest Northwest Highlands. Early showery rain over Wales passes into England, clearing northeast for sun through high cloud afternoon; windy here too. Warm, but feeling chilly in wind.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Gales, becoming severe; drizzle, a little patchy rain

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 6 September, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	South to southwesterly 45 to 55mph, powerful gusts through passes and on some downslopes to the north/east. Strengthening, sustained speeds to 60mph over tops, gusting up to 70mph. Increasingly challenging conditions on exposed terrain, walking and balance difficult in places, not just on high terrain. Later gusts will make remaining on you feet difficult. Feeling chilly in exposure despite mild air.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzle, some early and late patchy rain Early patchy rain soon breaks into a lingering drizzle on most high terrain, as well as lower on southern aspects. Later in the day, several pulses of rain return from the west, the least amount of rain towards Lochnagar.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Starting fairly extensive, higher breaks forming northeast Varied low cloud, but may cover areas near Callander frequently to mid-slopes. Some breaks forming and a few high tops east of the A9 may see some clear windows, but cloud will return more broadly with later rain. 30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of weak sun mainly east. Visibility improves as cloud lifts, but will deteriorate with a building haze from the south.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	10C, humid all day, rising on some slopes to 12 to 14C, warmest east. Notably cooling overnight. Feeling like 0 to 3C directly in the wind. Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 7 September, 2026

Generally unsettled onward into next week with spells of rain and showers moving in from the Atlantic , accompanied by frequently strong to gale force mountain winds. Temperatures will vary, mildest toward the south, but cooler air moves in from the north at times bringing higher Scottish tops occasionally close to freezing point. A few high pressure ridges will briefly bring brighter drier spells: Wednesday likely sees a brief good weather window, though cloud moves into the west with time, and indications suggest another window may arise Friday into Saturday, though this remains uncertain. Longer settled windows forming from mid-month, particularly England and Wales. Temperatures will be generally near or above average. best sunny windows around east hill groups.
