

Southeastern Highlands

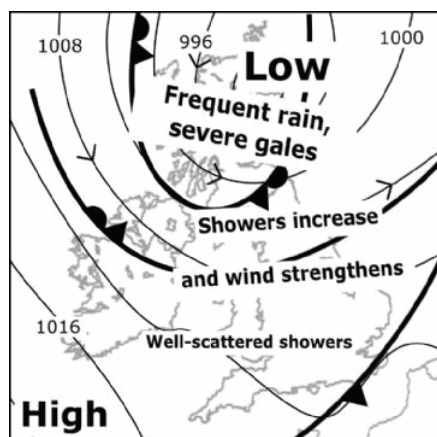
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Tuesday, 8 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 8 September, 2026

Frequent rain and severe gales over Scottish Highlands, easing from west later; feeling cold. Strong wind with showers and sun breaks in south Scotland and England, showers increasingly frequent from north, extended falls forming. Showers scattered in Wales, least rain south with lighter wind.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Severe gales; rain increasingly frequent, persistent afternoon

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 8 September, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Westerly 50-65mph, some variability, but may approach 70mph over high tops at times. Shifting northwesterly, easing slightly towards central highlands, but staying very strong towards Glenshee until nighttime. Difficult conditions in exposure all day: you will struggle to stay on your feet with buffeting gusts knocking you around; significant wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Bands of rain, setting in afternoon Bands of showery rain pass southeastward across the Munros, heavy falls mostly towards central highlands. A window of more scattered rain to the east in the morning, but increasingly setting in, widely persistent through afternoon, only later beginning to break up.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Fairly extensive Blanket cloud shrouds high terrain, lowest bases towards central highlands, to middle slopes or lower during heavier rain. A few breaks, notably east through morning, but afternoon sees cloud spread more widely to middle slopes, only breaking up again evening into night. 40% east, lowering to 10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bright glimpses at times, perhaps a sunny burst to the east, but trending overcast. Varied visibility, largely poor on summits, but very good out of cloud and rain.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	5 or 6C, rising a degree. Feeling like -5 to -10C in direct wind. Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 9 September, 2026

Weather remains varied from the weekend into next week, Scotland most often unsettled, best windows of improvement to the south. A more settled period is indicated in the later month with warm temperatures.
