

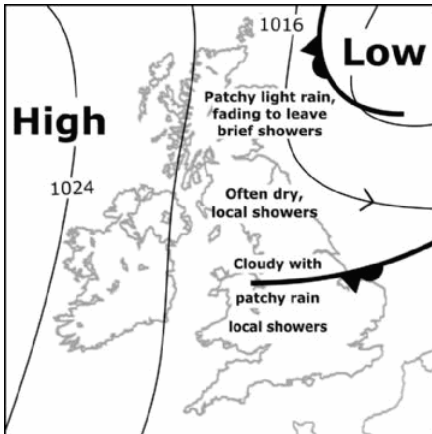
Southern Uplands

The Galloway hills eastward to the Lammermuir hills. The Cheviots (including higher hills within the adjacent Northumberland NP).



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General Summary for Thursday, 11 July, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2024

Extensive cloud, more frequent rain in the morning on Snowdon range and in the Cairngorms. Sunny spells likeliest on the western Scottish coast. where cloud may lift during the day above most hills, leaving highest Munros in clouds. Windy on the eastern Highlands. Mostly cool temperatures.

Headline for Southern Uplands

Mostly cloudy, some sun westward, locally drizzly showers

| How windy? (On the summits) | Northerly 10 to 20mph. |
| Effect of wind on you? | Small. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | A few showers between long dry spells Often dry, but a few showers possibly here and there. However, in any given place most of the day dry. |
| Cloud on the hills? | Extensively clearing, except more western summits in Galloway Western hills in Galloway intermittently covered all day, above 650m after dawn, and 750m by afternoon. Elsewhere, cloud on some higher areas progressively lifting through morning. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | 80% by early afternoon |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Mostly cloudy only occasional sun. Visibility excellent. |
| How Cold? (at 750m) | 5 to 8C |
| Freezing Level | Above the summits |

| How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you? | Northerly, 10-15mph west, 15-20mph east, at times 25mph higher Cheviots. Mostly small effect on walking, but feeling distinctly cool for July on higher tops in the east. | North to northeasterly, 10-15mph toward Galloway, 20-25mph east of M74. Risk gusts over 40mph on easternmost hills. Mostly small, may become blustery and affect comfortable walking in the east afternoon. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Toward east brief showers Brief light showers possible toward Cheviots. Most likely dry west of M74. | Showers mainly east Showery rain, mainly in the east, possible heavier burst for a while in Cheviots. Most of the day dry toward Galloway. |
| Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits? | Mostly on eastern tops, clearer west Toward the Borders clouds coming and going over higher slopes, especially The Cheviot; tending to lift above tops afternoon. In the west, most hills free of cloud all day. 60% east, to 90% west. | Hills clear west, covered east West of M74 corridor widely clear, only briefly patches of fog here and there in the early morning. Toward Cheviots thick clouds, hardly any breaks. 80% west, 20% east |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Patchwork of sun best in west, sunniest in morning. Often cloudier Borders. Mostly very good visibility. | Hardly any sunshine toward the Borders, especially Cheviots overcast. The more west, the more sunshine. Good visibility west of M74. |
| How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level | 8 to 12C, coldest furthest east. If exposed to stronger breezes around The Cheviot summit, feeling near freezing. Above the summits | 8 to 11C, coldest east Above the summits |

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 12 July, 2024

Extensively dry over the next few days, although with one or two 'shallow' areas of low pressure close to Britain, rain is likely for a few hours in some areas - or sometimes afternoon heavy showers. Generally winds light; some sunshine, but overall fairly extensive cloud. A little less cold.
