

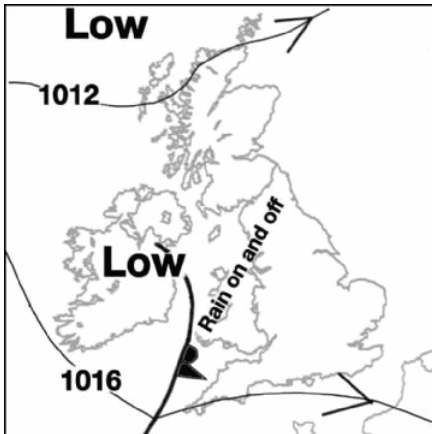
# Southern Uplands

The Galloway hills eastward to the Lammermuir hills. The Cheviots (including higher hills within the adjacent Northumberland NP).



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## General Summary for Saturday, 27 July, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 27 July, 2024**

The remains of a front will bring a mostly cloudy day with rain on and off southern. Scotland southwards, whilst further north only isolated showers. Winds light, except in the far north of Scotland, and temporarily in west Wales, where blustery.

### Headline for Southern Uplands

Mostly cloudy; showery rain, clearing evening

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 27 July, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwest turning westerly, 10mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Often negligible.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Showery rain on and off; clearing toward evening</b> Rain on and off - ranging from bursts of heavy rain (mainly Borders), to lighter rain for perhaps an hour. Will clear completely at the end of the afternoon from the west.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Generally extensive but clearing evening</b> Very varied through the day and from place to place. In and after steadier rain, fragments on lower slopes and extensive above 500m. But at other times most confined above 750m. All clearing from west later afternoon and evening.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>30%; rising to 90% evening</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Sunshine rare, before bright sun spreads east to end the day. Visibility mostly good, although poor in rain, excellent evening.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	10C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South to southwesterly, 10 to 15mph.	Southerly 20 to 25mph. Perhaps 30mph The Cheviot late in day.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly negligible.</b>	<b>Mostly fairly small.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Rain very unlikely</b>	<b>Rain very unlikely</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Very little indeed</b>	<b>Very little if any</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine. Excellent or perhaps superb visibility.	Sunshine, although often weak (due to high level cloud). Excellent visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	11C, rising to 14 to 17C mid afternoon, warmest Border summits.	11C near Solway coast, but in afternoon as high as a warm 17C Borders.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 28 July, 2024**

Continued winds from the southwest will bring low cloud and occasional rain mainly to the NW Highlands. Otherwise largely or completely dry until around the middle of next week, with periods of sun and light wind - sometimes blustery NW Scotland.
