

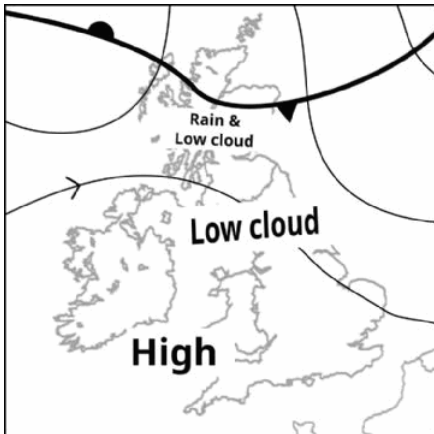
Southern Uplands

The Galloway hills eastward to the Lammermuir hills. The Cheviots (including higher hills within the adjacent Northumberland NP).



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General Summary for Friday, 1 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 1 November, 2024

Widely dull and overcast, in Highlands frequent rain, especially in the north, where windy at start. Mostly mild or warm. In England and Wales isolated spots of drizzle possible, but generally dry. Best chances for sun in northern Scotland in the afternoon, after the rain has passed.

Windy start, a little rain, overcast and dull, mild

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 1 November, 2024

| How windy? (On the summits) | Starting westerly, 30-40mph east of M74, toward Solway Firth 15-25mph. Gradually easing to 10-20mph. |
| Effect of wind on you? | In the morning considerable buffeting in the east, near Galloway just a little blustery. Becoming small everywhere. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Spots of rain afternoon Light rain afternoon in most places for an hour or two, before noon mostly dry, odd spot of drizzle possible. |
| Cloud on the hills? | Extensive Cloud widely covering the hills, only at start some breaks possible, but cloud increasingly thick toward the afternoon. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | 20% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Overcast and dull. Poor visibility. |
| How Cold? (at 750m) | 6 to 9C. With wind chill in the morning feeling near freezing in the east. |
| Freezing Level | Above the summits. |

| Effect of wind on you? | Negligible. | Small or negligible. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Rain unlikely Risk occasional drizzle from low cloud. | Extensively dry, risk local drizzle Chance localised drizzle toward Solway. |
| Cloud on the hills? | Extensive at start, may locally break Hills covered in cloud from 500-800m upward at start, cloud slowly lifting, may partly break. | Cloud in the valleys, clear higher up Low cloud and fog in the valleys, from mid-slopes upward clear. Lower down cloud may persist the whole day. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | 30% | 70% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Very little or no sun. Very good visibility if not in cloud. | Plenty of sunshine and excellent visibility if above the cloud. |
| How Cold? (at 750m) | 8 to 9C | Around 9C |
| Freezing Level | Above the summits. | Above the summits. |

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 2 November, 2024**

Back to high pressure conditions for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion developing means often very misty or cloudy, but tops sometimes above cloud - especially the Munros. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until mid next week, when a weak front passage will probably deteriorate weather for a day, at least in Scotland. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and even warmer weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week.
