

### General Summary for Friday, 18 April, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 18 April, 2025

Windy for England, Wales and southern Scotland, strengthening across the Highlands with time. Largely dry for Scotland and northern England, a little rain toward southwest Scotland; low cloud for a time southeast Highlands, hazy sun best toward north. Rain on and off for Wales, most persistent south.

#### **Headline for Southern Uplands**

Increasingly windy. A little rain toward west.

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 18 April, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly 25-30mph at dawn. Shifting easterly with winds rising to 35-40mph, strongest Galloway and near Central Belt, later in day 45-50mph around some tops.	
Effect of wind on you?	Walking impeded with stability often affected in highest wind, buffeting becoming frequent. Notable wind chill.	
How wet?	Occasional rain mostly west	
(Precipitation and its impact)	A little rain on and off in Galloway. Substantially dry to the east through a few stray afternoon showers.	
Cloud on the hills?	Some cloud caps over tops, mostly west	
	Occasional cloud caps drifting over high terrain though often clear. Cloud may be longer-lived in south Galloway. Cheviot hills largely clear.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%, 60% west	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Little or no sun, weak through high cloud. Visibility mostly good.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	4 or 5C, warming slightly in Galloway Wind chill near -5C.	
Freezing Level	Above the summits

#### **Planning Outlook**

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 19 April, 2025

A complex weather pattern continues this weekend and early next week as slow-moving centres of low pressure drift around toward the west and south, bringing mostly easterly winds with varied speeds day-to-day. However, a good deal of dry weather over the Easter weekend, just isolated showers. Into next week, areas of showery rain, most widely England and Wales on Monday and Tuesday. Drier for the Highlands as high pressure expands in from the north. Largely dry for England & Wales from midweek. Often on the cool side, particularly eastern hills, near to freezing higher Scottish tops. Warmest and sunniest in western regions. Occasional frost overnight into glens.

#### Forecast issued at 16:00 on Thursday, 17 April, 2025
