
## **Southern Uplands**

# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 4 June, 2025

Cold: showers (very frequent west) of hail and on higher slopes snow and gale force upland winds. Southward into England and Wales, a little less cold, progressively fewer showers and decreasingly windy.

#### **Headline for Southern Uplands**

Blustery. Showers, mainly morning.

### Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 4 June, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 25 to 30mph, gustiest in and around showers.		
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small, although noticeably impeding ease of walking on higher tops where wind chill considerable.		
How wet?	Showers, mainly morning.		
(Precipitation and its impact)	Scattered showers - in places the rain frequent over an hour or mid to late morning.		
Cloud on the hills?	learing the summits by or soon after midday		
	Cloud will shroud higher areas frequently morning; the base may drop below 400m for an hour or two Galloway and 500m elsewhere.  Will improve middle of day as most or all cloud lifts above the summits.		
Chance of cloud free summits?	90% afternoon		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bursts of sunshine; becoming sunnier through afternoon. Visibility very good or excellent.		
How Cold? (at 750m)	3C rising to 6C. Feeling as cold as -4C where exposed to the wind.

	Cloud on higher slopes at times morning will probably lift above the summits. Where rain occurs, cloud base will drop again, perhaps below 500m Galloway.	Cloud base rising; by late morning most cloud above the summits.

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sun, although there may well be extensive thin high level cloud weakening the sunshine.  Excellent visibility.	Patches of sunshine, although particularly morning, mostly cloudy Galloway. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	6C.	5C near the coast, rising to 7 to 9C, warmest east of M74.

#### **Planning Outlook**

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 5 June, 2025

Remaining chilly (intermittently near freezing point highest Scottish summits) for the remainder of the week - and probably most of next week. Rainfall and low cloud will remain frequent across particularly western mountains. Often windy higher summits - although mostly speeds below gale force.
