
Southern Uplands

The Galloway hills eastward to the Lammermuir hills. The Cheviots (including higher hills within the adjacent Northumberland NP).



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General Summary for Thursday, 5 June, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 5 June, 2025

Still cold, particularly Scottish Highlands where in morning higher summits below freezing point. Here showery, particularly NW - hail, and snow higher tops. Further south rain on and off morning before improving to sunshine and scattered showers. Much less windy - still strongest N Scotland.

Headline for Southern Uplands

Fairly light wind. Still chilly. Risk of a little rain, mainly morning.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 5 June, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest veering westerly 20mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Small.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	A few showers; possibly wet for an hour or two morning Scattered or isolated showers afternoon. Possibly in the morning steer light rain over an hour or so near the Solway.	
Cloud on the hills?	All clearing afternoon Morning: Cloud on higher slopes at times; where rain occurs, cloud base will drop, perhaps below 400m Galloway. Afternoon: All or almost all clearing.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	40% morning to 90% afternoon	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sun, mainly afternoon. Excellent visibility by afternoon.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	6C.	
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	West backing southwesterly 15mph Small	Direction varied, 10mph or less morning. From the west becoming northwesterly 10 to perhaps by evening 20mph or 25mph. Small or negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk of showers Showers: very few morning, then through afternoon showers more widely, some heavy.	Heavy slow moving showers; thunder Risk rain on and off in some areas morning. Then heavy showers forming and drifting about only slowly. Hail and small risk thunder.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Clearing most or probably all summits by afternoon Cloud base rising; by late morning most cloud above the summits.	Summits cloud free for periods, but forming from lower slopes in rain. Confidence in detail low: Many summits probably clearing for periods as through morning cloud base rises. But in rain, very varied as patches form from lower slopes up, particularly above forest canopies - whilst in other areas breaks persist to higher slopes. 60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sunshine, although particularly morning, mostly cloudy Galloway. Excellent visibility.	Sunshine coming through only rarely. Excellent or superb visibility in very clear air, but expect areas of very poor visibility in and after rain.
How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level	5C near the coast, rising to 7 to 10C, warmest east of M74. Above the summits.	5C rising to 9C. Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 6 June, 2025

Remaining chilly until Sunday night (intermittently near freezing point highest Scottish summits). Rainfall and low cloud will remain frequent across particularly western mountains until well into next week. Intermittently windy.
