
# **West Highlands**

Western Highlands accessible from, and south of, Glenfinnan (Road to the Isles) and Glen Spean (includes Creag Meagaidh). This area include Ben Nevis and the mountains around Glencoe. In the east, includes Ben Alder south to Loch Lomond and Trossachs NP. Includes Arran and Mull.



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## General Summary for Saturday, 15 January, 2022



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 15 January, 2022

Areas of low cloud at various levels, but may shroud western Scotland much of the day, patchy drizzle. Breaks north and east across the Highlands. Hills mostly clear northern England. Patchy fog. Low cloud likely to spread across Wales from south. Local gusty wind. Dropping near freezing some slopes, plus frost some valleys.

#### **Headline for West Highlands**

Low cloud fairly extensive, drizzle mainly coastal hills. Local breaks.

### Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 15 January, 2022

How windy? (On the Munros)	South to southwesterly 15 to 20mph, locally 25-30mph around some tops and corries.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small inland, but locally rather gusty not just on highest slopes. Occasional buffeting and marked wind chill where exposed.	
How wet?	Patchy light showers near coast	
(Precipitation and its impact)	Local drizzly showers, snow flurries on Munros, mostly hills nearest the west coast and sea lochs, may encroach further into Loch Lomond NP.	
Cloud on the hills?	the hills? Lowest around coasts, breaks north	
	Varied in extent and elevation. Near west coast and across western Loch Lomond NP, often shrouded above 500-700m, but foggy to some lower slopes. Further inland and north, cloud more broken, some tops above lower fog.	
Chance of cloud free Munros?	20% near coasts; 60% inland Lochaber.	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy, occasional sun mainly inland across Lochaber. Misty some glens and lower slopes, chance of some high tops being clear above cloud banks.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	Around 0C, but may be 2C for a time inland; small variation of temperature with increasing height.  Directly in strongest wind, feeling as cold as -10C.	
Freezing Level	Likely to drop just below freezing point from about 800-900m upward. Locally slight frost glens well inland.

Effect of wind on you?	Blustery across the hills, buffeting and marked wind chill in places on higher slopes.	Mostly small, but may be blustery on some tops just at first, and more widely toward evening.

(Precipitation and its impact)	Often dry, but occasional patches of rain, sleet or snow on the Munros, most common western hills, particularly west of Loch Linnhe.	
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly persistent high tops, lowest west	Mostly very little
	Often shrouding higher areas above 800 to 1000m, lowest toward west coast, sometimes filling in below 600m around Mull. Toward the central Highlands, breaks more common, at times to highest tops.	Banks of cloud may cover some slopes, mainly areas near and west of Loch Linnhe, where may drift around for a few hours, but likely to break up. Some high tops above cloud.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun mostly well inland. A general haze west coast, misty at times; visibility mostly good inland.	Frequently sunny with excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	-1 to +1C	Locally near 0C at dawn, rising to around 5C most areas. Hills warmer than inland glens.
Freezing Level	May vary; near or just below freezing above 800 to 1050m, perhaps higher toward south, beware of icy surfaces.	Pockets of frost, particularly inland glens, higher terrain also at least part-frozen, but air temperature rising well above zero.

#### **Planning Outlook**

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 16 January, 2022

Weakening fronts will pass southwards across Britain during Sunday, bringing small amounts of precipitation. Close to freezing on higher mountains, beware of hardened snow patches and ice in places. High pressure briefly rebuilds into Monday with air temperatures rising well above zero on most hills, although a frosty start in many valleys. Damp and mild southwesterlies into Tuesday bring extensive cloud, rain or drizzle, wettest in western Scotland. Windy into midweek in the north. A cold front is likely to bring rain turning to hill snow in Scotland, leading to a chillier second half of the week. Some further dry days are expected for all as high pressure returns with inversion conditions for some areas.
