
## **West Highlands**

Western Highlands accessible from, and south of, Glenfinnan (Road to the Isles) and Glen Spean (includes Creag Meagaidh). This area includes Ben Nevis and the mountains around Glencoe. In the east, from Ben Alder south to Loch Lomond and Trossachs NP. Also Arran and Mull.

# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 20 October, 2025

Much of the Highlands dry all day with light winds; varied banks of cloud will linger, on some lower slopes in morning. Overnight rain clearing may linger in far north. Local showers near west coast. Bursts of rain for Wales, more persistent south, extend increasingly into Peak District. Local showers possible N Eng/S Scot.

#### **Headline for West Highlands**

Mostly dry, patchy low cloud banks. Light wind.

### Detailed Forecast for Monday, 20 October, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Direction variable, mostly 10mph or less. Coastal areas southeasterly 15-20mph.

How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Largely dry, some coastal showers Substantially dry. An odd patch of drizzle locally in the morning. Some patchy showery rain near southern islands and coasts. Rain tends to push back inland tonight, fairly patchy.

Effect of wind on you?	Varied - initially small, for longest inland, but expect increasingly blustery conditions to develop, risk more challenging.	Fairly small, but feeling blustery on exposed higher tops, may affect balance on some ridges. Marked wind chill.
How wet?	Coastal showers	Local coastal showers
(Precipitation and its impact)	Showery rain may be frequent on coastal areas and the islands. Occasional showers drifting inland, fewer lighter showers further inland toward central highlands. #### **Planning Outlook**

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 21 October, 2025

A mixed outlook this week as low pressure dominates with areas of rain and showers, which will vary locally day-to-day. Some windows of drier weather, particularly central parts of the Highlands. Wind speeds will also vary, some lulls, but abrupt spells of upland gales possible. Risk of heavier rain spreading from Wales into northern England and southern Scotland later Wednesday into Thursday. Significantly colder later in the week with northerly winds, dropping below freezing on higher mountains, with snow showers especially Scottish Munros.
