


# Yorkshire Dales and North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, also south to Forest of Bowland and Ilkley Moor.



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## General Summary for Wednesday, 15 September, 2021



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 15 September, 2021

Light wind across the country. However, in a fairly humid air mass - with a weak front reaching western Scotland - low cloud will be extensive at first although many summits will clear. Here and there showers, but rain on and off near Loch Linnhe and coastal NW Highlands.

#### Headline for Yorkshire Dales and North Pennines

Light wind; risk of a shower. Low cloud gradually clearing.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 15 September, 2021

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Direction varied 10mph or less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Negligible</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Risk isolated bursts of rain</b> Very likely dry. However, risk of one or two showers.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Most or all summits clearing</b> Post dawn, patches of fog, from lower slopes up. Will improve through morning as patches of fog, from lower slopes up, mostly or completely lift to clear the summits. Risk in western dales south of Kirkby Stephen of cloud coming and going above 300m.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90% by midday</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Patchwork of sunshine developing by midday. Good visibility although a haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>	12C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	17 to 20C in the afternoon, coldest western dales in north Yorkshire.

## Yorkshire Dales and North Pennines - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 16 September	Friday 17 September
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly 10 to perhaps 15mph on higher tops.	Southerly between 15 and perhaps 25mph; generally strongest morning.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly negligible.</b>	<b>Fairly small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain not expected</b>	<b>Little or no rain</b> Very likely dry: only low risk of the odd burst of rain reaching westernmost fells.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Most or all summits clearing</b>  Widespread cloud higher areas from dawn, the cloud covering lower slopes western dales south of Kirkby Stephen. The base will rise to clear most or all fells, although cloud may come and go on highest tops.	<b>Very little if any</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>80%</b>	<b>80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun developing. Excellent visibility by about midday.	Occasional sunshine, overall extensive high level cloud. Good visibility although a haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>	11C	12C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Will reach 19C in the afternoon, warmest eastern dales.	Will rise to 18 to perhaps 21C in the afternoon.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 16 September, 2021**

On Friday, a weakening Atlantic front will bring in rain (mainly to the W & NW Highlands), and stronger winds to western mountains.

As yet detailed confidence not high for the weekend and early next week. There will be a build of pressure following Friday's rain to give substantially fine weather, but the remnants of fronts may still give one or two 'poor' periods, with low cloud and occasional rain.
