
Yorkshire Dales and North Pennines

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General Summary for Thursday, 23 June, 2022



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 23 June, 2022

Warm and quite humid with strong sunshine for most areas. Light to moderate southerly winds. The west coast of Scotland will hold on to banks of low cloud, but some breaks forming. High cloud builds over Wales and central England, may locally result in a thunderstorm toward evening, drifting northwards.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales and North Pennines

Warm, mostly sunny, light winds. Chance a late shower.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 23 June, 2022

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 10 to 15mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Chance of a late thundery shower Dry much of the day. By evening, risk of localised bursts of rain forming or moving up from south, chance of an isolated thunderstorm.	
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Hills clear Any local patches on western slopes from dawn will soon all disperse. Then patches forming only very late in day if showers occur. Above 90%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine, high cloud building from south afternoon into evening from the south. Visibility very good, slight haze.	
How Cold? (at 700m)	13C at dawn, rising to 17C, feeling humid.	
And in the valleys	9 to 12C at dawn. Rising to 22 to 25C in the afternoon, warmest eastern Dales.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southerly or variable, 10 to 20mph or sometimes less. Tending to increase into evening. Mostly small, but sudden gusts may form around bursts of rain.	Southerly, but may vary, typically 10 to 20mph, occasionally gusty 30mph in places during and prior to rain. Mostly small, but sometimes gusty which may impede walking on higher tops.
How wet?	Increasing risk thundery downpours	Risk heavy downpours forming
(Precipitation and its impact)	Chance of bursts of rain locally from early morning, but forming mostly afternoon onward. By evening, possible areas of rain lasting an hour or more. Some heavy downpours, risk hail and thunder.	Local areas of rain are possible early in the day, but several hours likely largely dry. Showers then forming into afternoon, some heavy bursts, likely focused on western areas, risk of hail and isolated thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little much of day	Often above the hills
	Prior to rain, many hills largely clear, apart from banks here and there from dawn. However, where rain develops, cloud lowering widely, to form extensively at various levels, patches to lowest slopes.	A few patches around hills early morning, generally dispersing. Then most cloud above the hills, but local patches forming around higher tops during and after showers, in places fragments to lower slopes.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A mix of some strong sun and periods where high cloud may fill in. Visibility very good, slight haze forming, reducing if rain develops.	Sunshine mostly morning before cloud builds and tends to fill in. Visibility often very good, but reduced where rain occurs.
How Cold? (at 700m)	13C rising to 15 to 17C, feeling humid.	7C rising to 11C.
And in the valleys	Mild from dawn, 12 to 14C, soon rising, reaching 20 to 24C, warmest eastern Dales.	Cooler overall, starting around 7 to 10C, reaching 17 to 20C by afternoon.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 24 June, 2022

Turning more unsettled for several days through the weekend into early next week as a slow-moving area of low pressure affects Britain. Conditions will vary day-to-day, locally escaping dry some days, but expect some areas of persistent rain mixed with heavy or sometimes thundery showers almost anywhere. Wind speed also varied, mostly south or southwesterly, strengthening at times, may reach gale force on the high tops into next week. Feeling warm where sunshine develops, but cool in cloud and rain. Cloud will come and go on the hills, but lowering extensively during rain.
