

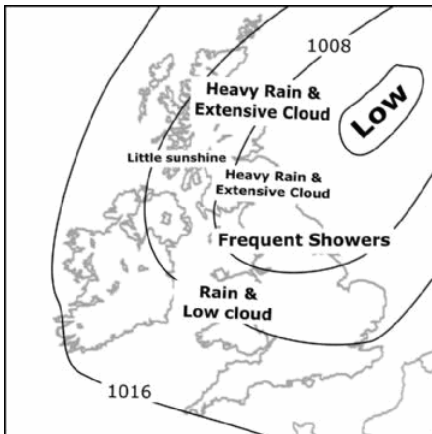
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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General Summary for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 July, 2024

Rain widely in Highlands, particularly Cairngorms, where risk of local flooding - although very little rain in total near west coast and central belt. Showery bursts of rain southern Scotland southwards, although total rainfall in Wales (specially south and east) will be small. Hardly any sunshine and many higher areas foggy.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Mostly dull with areas of rain drifting slowly about

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	N Pennines: varied direction 10mph. Yorkshire dales: Southwest or westerly 20mph; sometimes 30mph on highest tops.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Areas of showery rain drifting about slowly Will vary from discrete showers to areas of showery rain, perhaps lasting a couple of hours - particularly N Pennines. Generally less rain Yorkshire dales.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive all day Fog very extensive above 400 to 550m, sometimes forming from forest canopies up. However, particularly afternoon, some breaks to or locally above 650m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Rare glimpses of sun only. Often misty, although particularly later in day, visibility very good for periods.
How Cold? (at 700m)	10C. Feeling near/below freezing if exposed to stronger wind speeds on tops.
And in the valleys	15 to 17C

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 10 to 20mph.	Mostly northerly, 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Light showers Brief, mostly light showers, most likely in the morning.	Chance showers east Brief showers possible, highest risk eastern slopes.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clearing early Hills often covered at dawn, mostly clearing early in the day. Eastern and southern slopes latest to clear, but likely also before or around noon.	Hills mostly clear except northeast Cloud base largely above the hills, possibly lowering if showers occur. North of Kirkby Stephen eastern slopes may see clouds coming and going.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Generally overcast, chance for some breaks in the south. Visibility becoming very good.	Patchwork of sun and clouds. Least sunshine east. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 700m)	5 to 8C	9 to 10C
And in the valleys	12 or 13C at dawn, rising to 14C	8C rising to 16C

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 11 July, 2024

Cool rest of the week. On Thursday light showers, particularly in northern England, southern Scotland and Wales, Highlands mostly dry. Generally improving toward the weekend, locally showers on Friday, wettest in northern Scotland. Low still circulating east of England may bring wet spells on eastern Highlands and Cheviots on both Friday and during the weekend, but western Highlands, Lake District and Pennines should stay mostly dry and get some sun. Again more widespread rain beginning of next week.
