

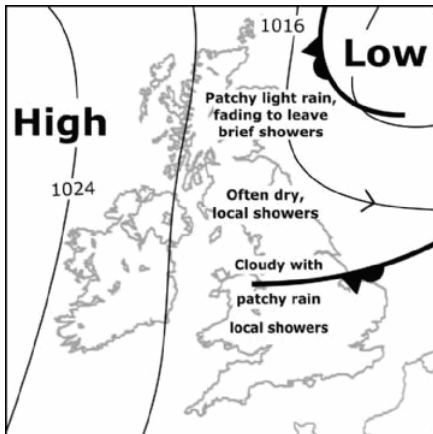
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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General Summary for Thursday, 11 July, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2024

Extensive cloud, more frequent rain in the morning on Snowdon range and in the Cairngorms. Sunny spells likeliest on the western Scottish coast. where cloud may lift during the day above most hills, leaving highest Munros in clouds. Windy on the eastern Highlands. Mostly cool temperatures.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Mostly cloudy, some sun westward, locally showers

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 11 July, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Light showers possible Brief, light showers, most likely in the morning toward the south, but possible any time of the day in all areas. Least likelihood around midday.
Cloud on the hills?	Covered morning, later partly clearing Extensive cloud above 450m from dawn, and some patches on lower slopes. Will gradually improve as by early afternoon most cloud lifts above highest summits.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Rising to 90% by early afternoon
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive cloud, bursts of sunshine now and again. Visibility becoming good.
How Cold? (at 700m)	5 to 8C
And in the valleys	12 or 13C at dawn, rising to 14C

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Northerly, 15 to 20mph, at times 25mph higher areas, mainly toward north and east. Fairly small effect on walking, but feeling distinctly cool for July, especially higher North Pennines.	Northerly, mostly 20 to 25mph, gusting 30-35mp. Fairly small, may start to affect comfortable walking on highest exposed tops.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Light showers east Brief showers possible, highest risk eastern slopes.	Showers mostly eastern Pennines Frequent, but mostly light showers on the eastern Pennines, more often dry toward the Western Dales but also showers possible. High uncertainty.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Hills mostly clear except northeast Cloud base largely above the hills, possibly lowering if showers occur. North of Kirkby Stephen eastern slopes may see clouds coming and going. 70%	Hills in the east covered Mostly clear southwest of Kirkby Stephen, but especially eastern slopes of Pennines much of the day in clouds. 40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun and clouds. Least sunshine east. Very good visibility.	Little sunshine in the east, more brighter spells toward Howgills. Good visibility.
How Cold? (at 700m) And in the valleys	7C, only slight rise N Pennines, up to 10C afternoon W Yorks Dales. In the breeze, feeling near-freezing highest tops. 8C rising to 16C	8 to 10C 11C, rising to 15C in the west

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 12 July, 2024

Extensively dry over the next few days, although with one or two 'shallow' areas of low pressure close to Britain, rain is likely for a few hours in some areas - or sometimes afternoon heavy showers. Generally winds light; some sunshine, but overall fairly extensive cloud. A little less cold.
