

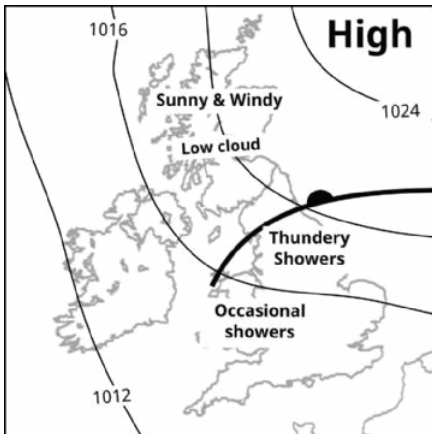
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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General Summary for Sunday, 1 September, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 1 September, 2024

Mostly dry in Scotland, late afternoon showers possible in Southern Uplands and toward the evening in Southern Highlands. Unstable through England, with thundery rain here and there. Localised light showers in Snowdonia. Patchy sun for most, best Cairngorms and far north.

Patchy sun, risk thundery showers afternoon

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 1 September, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly 20 to 25mph. Risk 30mph around midday.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking inconvenienced by the wind at times. Should higher speeds materialise, your balance will be affected.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Late afternoon locally showers, perhaps heavy & thundery Dry morning followed by bursts of rain here and there in the afternoon, locally heavy and thundery.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive cloud, lifting, but may return Widespread cloud in the morning on high ground. This will lift above most summits but remain mostly overcast, cloud lowering down to the hills in and after rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloudy morning, later some patchy sun. Good visibility when out of cloud.
How Cold? (at 700m)	13C. Feeling humid.
And in the valleys	9C rising to 17 to 19C.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Forecast confidence still low: Variable direction, 10 to 25mph, strongest later in the day. Mostly small.	West to northwesterly, 10 to 25mph. Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Frequent rain, chance thunder Spells of rain, perhaps thundery at times. Highly uncertain details.	Possible rain, most likely early Significant uncertainty in the forecast, likeliest rain in the morning, perhaps heavy for a while, generally clearing from the west during the afternoon. Local showers still possible in the east.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Hills mostly covered Low clouds frequently covering higher areas. 20%	Hills widely clearing Hills covered in the morning, cloud rising gradually to clear most or all tops in the afternoon. Near and after showers ragged cloud patches may reform. 30% rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast. Variable visibility, poor in constant rain.	Starting cloudy, later patchwork of sun. Good visibility.
How Cold? (at 700m) And in the valleys	12 to 14C 15C at dawn, rising to 18C.	11C 14C at dawn rising to 16C.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 2 September, 2024

Low confidence in the forecast for beginning of the next week. Monday is likely to be unsettled with rain or most, locally thundery. Localised showers continues into Tuesday, although conditions shall improve through Tuesday afternoon. Up to mid-week the temperature is likely cooler than over the weekend. Mid-week onward widely dry and often sunny with high pressure rebuilding during the second half of the week, bringing significantly warmer air. Such conditions may continue even into the following week.
