

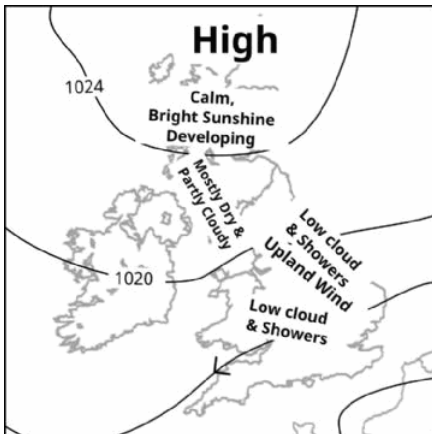
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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General Summary for Wednesday, 2 October, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 2 October, 2024

Sunny and dry in the Highlands, only glens in cloud in the morning. Rare showers in southern Scotland, more frequent in northern England - Lake District shall stay mostly dry, some sun here. Wet & cloudy morning in Peak District and on most Welsh hills, there slowly improving.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Windy and cool, morning showers, cloud slowly breaking

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 2 October, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	East to northeasterly, 25mph, to gusty 35mph on some slopes, through elevated passes and locally downslope to the west.
Effect of wind on you?	Varied, fairly small in places, but expect sudden buffeting gusts, not just on highest terrain. Marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Brief showers in the morning Light showers in the morning will affect especially eastern side of Pennines. Some showers may reach western dales. Becoming dry afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Most widespread morning in the east Banks of cloud rolling across the hills, lowest and most persistent toward eastern Pennines, base around 500-600m, lifting with time to higher slopes. Breaking up better into afternoon, especially in western areas.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Rising to 70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy, glimpses of sun toward west. More breaks in clouds in the afternoon. Visibility below cloud good, but slight haze.
How Cold? (at 700m)	5 to 8C, but feeling sub-zero in the wind.
And in the valleys	7C at dawn, rising to 12C.

How windy? (On the summits)	East to southerly, 10 to 20mph.	Southerly, 20 to 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.	Blustery, walking impeded on higher terrain, stability beginning to be affected. Marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Tops clear, valleys partly under low cloud Patches of fog in some valleys possible, common on the eastern side of the Pennines. Tops and higher slopes clear.	Locally fog/low cloud, but mostly clear Toward western dales fog or very low cloud in the morning, especially toward Howgills. Elsewhere hills likely cloud-free.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Lot of sunshine with some fair weather clouds afternoon. Very good visibility.	Sunny morning, just low cloud in some areas, particularly eastern slopes covered. In the afternoon bright sunshine everywhere. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 700m)	7 to 10C	7 to 9C, feeling around -5C in wind
And in the valleys	4C at dawn rising to 13-14C	5C at dawn, rising to 12C

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 3 October, 2024**

Dry and sunny Thursday, on Friday only in western Scotland deteriorating conditions, especially beware of severe winds in Highlands in general. Lowering pressure and southwesterly winds toward the weekend brings an unsettled spell- rain at times, briefly milder air. Likely turning colder again during the weekend onward into early next week. Cold and showery toward next Wednesday.
