

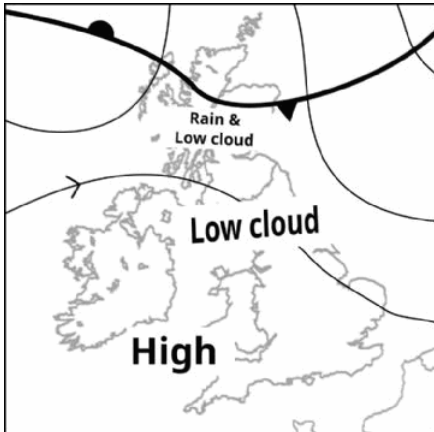
# Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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## General Summary for Friday, 1 November, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 1 November, 2024

Widely dull and overcast, in Highlands frequent rain, especially in the north, where windy at start. Mostly mild or warm. In England and Wales isolated spots of drizzle possible, but generally dry. Best chances for sun in northern Scotland in the afternoon, after the rain has passed.

Widely dry, mild and breezy. Mostly cloudy

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 1 November, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Starting west to southwesterly, 25 to 35mph. Gradually easing to 10-20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Blustery in the morning, comfortable walking impeded. Gusty on high passes and east facing slopes. Becoming small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Locally early drizzle</b> Very locally morning drizzle, but widely dry.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills covered, cloud slowly lifting and maybe breaking</b> Low cloud covering hills from lower slopes or valley bottoms upward, during the day cloud slowly lifting to clear lower slopes.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Most of the time overcast, one or two sunny hours possible. Excellent visibility if not in cloud, but most of the time dull due to cloud.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>	Around 11C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	10 to 13C, rising only a little through the day.

	<b>Saturday 2 November</b>	<b>Sunday 3 November</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Variable, mostly southwesterly, 5 to 15mph.	Mostly south or southeasterly, 10 to 20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Negligible.</b>	<b>Small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Risk occasional drizzle from low cloud.	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Firstly extensive, may break, likeliest east</b> Hills covered in cloud, most likely from 600-800m upward at start, but low cloud may also cover valleys. Cloud slowly lifting, may partly break. Chance for higher cloud base on the eastern slopes.	<b>Cloud in the valleys, clear higher up</b> Low cloud and fog in the valleys, from mid-slopes upward clear. Lower down cloud may persist the whole day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40%</b>	<b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sunshine, but generally cloudy.  Very good visibility if not in cloud.	Plenty of sunshine and excellent visibility if above the cloud.
<b>How Cold? (at 700m)</b>	Around 9C	Around 10C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	8 to 12C, rising only a little through the day.	9C rising to 13C

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 2 November, 2024**

Back to high pressure conditions for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion developing means often very misty or cloudy, but tops sometimes above cloud - especially the Munros. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until mid next week, when a weak front passage will probably deteriorate weather for a day, at least in Scotland. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and even warmer weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week.
