

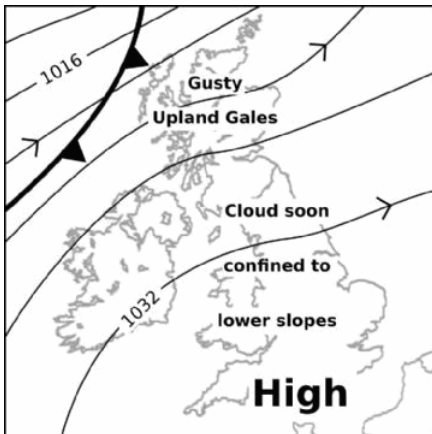
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

General Summary for Wednesday, 15 January, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 15 January, 2025

Strong upland gales and powerful gusts over the Highlands; wind getting increasingly lighter further south. Extensive cloud possible in the morning but will very soon be confined to the lower slopes and many summits will be cloud free and dry. Superb visibility on high ground, above haze layer. Feeling mild, especially where wind is light.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Low level fog but higher ground clear with excellent vis

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 15 January, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly typically 15 to 20mph, but locally 25mph higher North Pennine tops. Sudden gusts some on lower slopes.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small, but locally considerable buffeting, in places reaching lower slopes.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Precipitation unlikely Risk pockets of fine drizzle possible where in cloud.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive on lower ground Cloud may well have cleared higher fells overnight, leaving fog in places in valleys and on some lower slopes, particularly nearer the M6.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bright sunshine extensive; superb visibility higher slopes. Hazy or foggy lower areas, especially towards the south.
How Cold? (at 700m)	Varied: mostly between 5 and 8C - nearer 3C where in cloud. Will feel as cold as minus 7C in the wind.
And in the valleys	5 to 7C in the morning, rising to 8 to 10C in the afternoon. Continued thaw of remaining snow and locally still frozen terrain.
