



General Summary for Monday, 16 June, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 16 June, 2025

A front draped over the Highlands brings low cloud and drizzly rain to western areas, heavier rain pushing northwards in the afternoon. Southwesterly winds will strengthen later in Scotland, becoming gales on higher mountains by evening. Dry with sunny spells and cloud clearing the tops in England & Wales.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Moderate breeze, windier into evening. Early low cloud clearing.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 16 June, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	West then southwesterly, 20-25mph, up to 30mph high North Pennines early morning. Strengthening toward evening, reaching 35-40mph higher tops through to dusk and into night with possible stronger gusts northern areas.		
Effect of wind on you?	Breezy over higher fells, by evening increasingly affecting comfortable walking, becoming arduous higher areas up to sunset with marked wind chill.		
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected		
Cloud on the hills?	Patchy low cloud breaking up		
	Cloud banks mostly above 500-600m western Dales up to Tebay early morning, local patches on tops elsewhere. Tending to lift, thin and disperse, likely rising above all hills.		
Chance of cloud free summits?	50% rising to 90%		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy in western Yorks Dales in morning, some sun north & eastern areas. Improving to a patchwork of cloud and sun, very good visibility.		
How Cold? (at 700m)	11C, rising slightly afternoon. Will feel only just above freezing point directly in the wind early and late.		
And in the valleys	12C at dawn, rising to 17 to 20C in afternoon, warmest eastern dales.

Cloud on the hills?	Covering higher fells, lifting later	Any patches clearing
	Covering higher tops during rain, locally to 500-600m western Dales for a time. Bases rising and cloud tending to break, clearing most or all tops with time during the afternoon, soonest North Pennines.	Patches of cloud may drift over some higher slopes in morning, mainly western Dales. Likely to all lift above summits.
Chance of cloud free summits?	40% later 80%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloudy morning into early afternoon, then patchwork of sun coming through. Hazy, then visibility becoming very good.	Patchwork of sun, best eastern dales. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 700m)	11C.	8C rising to 11C.
And in the valleys	10C from dawn, rising to 18C afternoon.	11C at dawn, rising to 19C afternoon.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 17 June, 2025

Humid southwesterly winds early this week brings low cloud and spells of drizzly rain to western hills. High pressure to the south will tend to expand northwards during midweek, with dry conditions and warm air for all regions, sunshine and fair-weather cloud. Winds becoming light south to southeasterlies later in the week. Uncertainty by next weekend into early the following week, a risk of some rain or showers returning as pressure tends to fall.
